How Folks Over 70 Can Renew a California Driver's License


New option: May take an at-home video course in lieu of a traditional knowledge test

Application

- ✓ Even though renewal notices indicate that folks must visit a DMV office, they also encourage all applicants to start the process online
- ✓ Will need to create a MyDMV account, which requires an email address and a phone number to receive a verification text message or voice call
- ✓ Can submit REAL ID documents, take the knowledge test, and pay fee online, leaving only vision test, photo, thumbprint, and signature for office visit
- ✓ If existing license has been verified for REAL ID, folks don't need to re-submit the documents for your renewal

Knowledge test

- ✓ Required for renewal by drivers 70 and older, 3 ways to complete it:
 - ⇒ Take conventional test in DMV office at computer station or on paper
 - ⇒ Take the conventional test on your own computer at home, monitored by an online proctor
 - ⇒ Take a video course on your home computer or mobile device
- ✓ Conventional renewal test has 25 questions
 - ⇒ Must get at least 20 right to pass
 - \Rightarrow Have three attempts to pass
 - ⇒ After failing twice on home computer, must take last try at DMV office
- ✓ Home test features and requirements
 - ⇒ Computer must have a webcam to allow proctoring
 - ⇒ Must complete in one session, starting between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. weekdays
 - ⇒ Available in 35 languages




Knowledge test (continued)

- ✓ The eLearning video course
 - ⇒ Takes about 45 minutes
 - ⇒ Involves watching seven lessons and answering several questions about each
 - ⇒ Can be done on a tablet or smartphone as well as a computer
 - ⇒ Can be taken anytime
 - ⇒ Available only in English
 - ⇒ After you provide personal information, the DMV site presents two test options
 - MVProctor
 - eLearning
 - ⇒ An especially attractive feature: completing the course is the SAME as passing a knowledge test, so CANNOT FAIL

Appointment

- ✓ May schedule office visit online, after designating
 "DL/ID Renewal"
- ✓ Take *confirmation code* from online application online to DMV office *(important)*
- ✓ For first REAL ID application, also bring your identity and residence documents even if uploaded


Tips for Folks Over 70 Renewing CA Driver's License

Vision test

- ✓ The DMV has a *minimum of 20/40 with both* eyes together, with or without corrective lenses
- ✓ Drivers who fail to meet this minimum must have a vision specialist perform an examination and complete the DL-62 form
- ✓ If your vision is between 20/40 and 20/70, DMV will issue a 30-day license to allow continued driving until the DL-62 form is submitted to the DMV

Behind the Wheel Test

- ✓ Generally not required of an adult who has an existing license from California or any other state
- ✓ Drivers can be flagged for examination
 - ⇒ If they have mental or physical conditions
 - ⇒ When the DMV has reason to suspect that a person is an unsafe driver



Help Stave Off Cognitive Decline Shingles Vaccine Reduces Chance of Dementia by 20%

Most informed people understand and appreciate the value of vaccines for protection against dangerous (even deadly), debilitating, and excruciating infections — such as Shingles. Caused by the Herpes zoster virus, it produces an excruciatingly painful rash and often major complications of meningitis, weakness or paralysis of facial nerves, and persistent nerve pain. Before a vaccine was available, about 1 in 3 people age 60 or older suffered a serious and painful shingles infection during their lifetime.

Shingrix, introduced in 2017, is a safe and highly effective vaccine providing long-lasting protection, with an effectiveness rate of over 90% in preventing shingles. An earlier vaccine, Zostavax, introduced in 2006, was less effective, reducing risk of shingles by 50-70%.

A single episode of shingles increases the risk of dementia by about 20%, possibly by inducing neuroinflammation or direct neuronal injury. Consistent with this finding, shingles increases the formation of a protein called amyloid in the brain — this is one of the hallmarks of Alzheimer's disease.

The next logical question reverses this process: does receiving a shingles vaccine decrease the incidence of dementia? A group of researchers at the Harvard, University of Minnesota, and Taipei Medical Schools followed 147, 327 participants and found that those receiving a shingles vaccine were 20% less likely to develop dementia in the 7 years after vaccination.


