For all our Sirs who are in need of healing and comfort, we will keep you in our thoughts and prayers.



SIR BRANCH 149 2025 DUES INCREASE NOTICE

At the November 5, 2024 Branch 149 BEC (Branch Executive Committee) meeting the Board of Directors reviewed the projected Year End 2024 Financial Statement and voted unanimously that it would be necessary to increase our Annual Membership Dues

for individual members in order to maintain the financial stability of the Branch for future operating years effective January 2025.

The decision to increase Annual Membership Dues is never easy and the BEC members goal is to maintain it at the lowest possible level while insuring adequate annual revenue for Branch 149 activities and to maintain financial stability for the future.

The Branch 149 BEC voted to increase the Annual Membership Due to \$35 effective January 1, 2025.

Let me explain the reasons behind this increased Annual Due decision. The current Annual Membership Due is \$25 per member. Forty percent of that fee (\$10) is automatedly transferred to State Sir to support all the functions that they provide for all the Branches, including Insurance coverage, filing of required State and Federal tax forms, preparation and maintaining consistent Operation Manuals and forms for all Branches and training for Branch officers to insure we are incompliance with our

state charter. We are anticipating that State Sir will be increasing the mandatory State fee to cover the increased cost of insurance coverage throughout the State that we are all experiencing and inflation related increase in other areas. That will leave Branch 149 with less than \$15 per member to support the required activities and requirements at the local level. With a total membership of approximately 200 members, that will generate revenue of \$3,000 annually. Historically, we have also held a fundraising raffle at the Ladies Day Picnic that raises another \$1500-\$2,000 a year. So, we end up with an annual local revenue budget of between \$4,500-\$5,000.

How do we allocate these local funds? Of course, we have our annual fixed costs of postage, printing, office supplies and other essential costs which are all going up with inflation. A major portion of our expenses is the subsidy that we allocate to reduce the

ticket price for members to attend our two major events of the year-The Ladies Day Picnic and the Christmas Dinner which has ranged from \$7-\$15 per person depending on the event, cost and year. Also, we pay for a free lunch for all new members as a recruiting tool, lunches for all the speakers and entertainment and a free lunch for members recruiting new members.

Bottom line, we are going to finish the 2024 Fiscal year with just over \$2,000 in our reserve fund. The BEC directors have determined this is not a sufficient reserve level for Branch 149 to maintain the financial stability for the future and have approved

We hope all members understand that this was not an easy decision but definitely a necessary one.

We will begin to collect Annual Dues on January 7, 2025 at our first luncheon meeting of the year at the Elks Lodge. If you will not be at the meeting or prefer to mail it into, please make out a check to Sir 149 for \$35 and mail it to the address


