# **Rich Knowles**

Rich was a member of the 2011-2012 Contra Costa County Civil Grand Jury. He has been active in the California Grand Jurors' Association ever since. Rich has also been a member of SIR Branch 8 for a bit more than 3 years. For the 20 years prior to his retirement he worked at the Federal Home Loan Bank of San Francisco as a programmer and manager in IT. Prior to that he prepared expert witness testimony in various types of legal proceedings, including the economic justification for building new power plants and (separately) comparing solar electric generating plants to conventional power plants (this is in the late 70s and early 80s).

Rich will be talking about the Civil Grand Jury System in California. This system is set up by county and is the watchdog over local government. He will briefly describe what the system is, how it works, and what kind of reports get published, and he will discuss how you can be involved in the system – by volunteering to be a juror, by bringing issues to your local grand jury's attention, and by reading grand jury reports (all of which are published on the internet).

#### Theme: Rose Wine




