# Big Sir Message

Many of you have asked about our financials. Your Branch Executive Committee (BEC) has worked diligently over the last two years to solidify our financial position allowing us to pay our bills, provide support to Branch activities and secure the Branch's future and we will continue to do so. But first, a little history.

In the pre-pandemic years, costs for everything were much lower and we were able to pay our bills by retaining a small portion of each luncheon fee paid by our members. We ended 2019 with \$4,371.68 in cash. Then in March 2020, the pandemic hit and for several months we were unable to gather for lunch and our only income source ended. We finished 2020 with \$3,116.81 in cash and by

December 2021 our cash balance had dropped to \$2,989.55.

Coming out of the pandemic and seeing costs increase substantially, the BEC saw that our retained portion of luncheon fees alone would no longer be sufficient to support our obligations. The BEC made the decision to implement annual membership dues. In addition to increasing our revenue, all expenses were scrutinized and eliminated where it was appropriate to do so. As a result of these changes, we ended 2022 with a cash balance of \$4,464.71. With continued financial oversight, our cash balance on December 31, 2023 increased to \$7,742.17.

The question now is whether our current surplus is too high, too low, or about right.

The BEC has concluded that it's about right and has approved a budget for 2024 that maintains our surplus at the current level but provides additional support for the Mother's Day Luncheon, the Annual Picnic, and the Holiday Luncheon plus a contingency reserve of one year's expenses should an unexpected event occur that threatens the Branch's continued existence, leaving us with a year-end 2024 balance of \$\$6,687.67 in our General Account.

Going forward and absent any additional cost increases, you can expect to see no changes in member dues or luncheon costs this year. The BEC is committed to raising the funds we need but using those funds judiciously for the benefit of our members.






