



Discover the local alleys where this community has continued to flourish for over 150 years, despite harsh racial discrimination. Family associations and temples, dim sum, herbal apothecaries, and jade jewelry shops built by the local community, all contribute to the vibrancy of this place, one of the oldest and largest Chinese communities outside of China.

Here's a reminder for our hike to Mitchell Canyon, Mt. Diablo State Park, slated for April 12. I hope many of you can make it. And please remember, spouses are welcome too!

Our March hike is an easy 3 mile out-and-back with virtually no elevation gain or loss. Mitchell Canyon trail rambles alongside Mitchell Canyon Creek on a wide, flat, dirt/gravel path. An enjoyable, easy hike for **any experience level**. Lots of water in Mitchell Canyon Creek this year!

Directions: From Highway 680, take either Ygnacio Valley or Treat Blvd exit. Drive east for 4-5 miles to Clayton Road. Take a right onto Clayton Road.

Approximately 3 miles from Treat Blvd or 1 mile from Ygnacio Valley Road, take a right onto Mitchell Canyon Road. Drive approximately 2 miles to the very end of Mitchell Creek Road. There is a \$5.00 entrance fee to Mt. Diablo State Park. Parking is on the left in front of the visitor's center.

For those who wish to join us after the hike, we will be having lunch at the Mudville Grill, 6200 Center Street, downtown Clayton.
