Dine Around has found a new cuisine: Laotian food

What's the main difference between Vietnamese Food and Laotian Food? Vietnamese food typically has foods that have. Dishes are typically brought out with herbs, vegetables, and spices on the side. Typically, it's up to the diner to put mix the food together (example is the infamous pho dish). Lao food typically has cuisines that have herbs and vegetables minced in. Similar to Vietnamese food, most often, the herbs and vegetables aren't simmered for long periods (like Thai food). Lao cuisine also uses Padaek, which is fermented fish sauce, as an ingredient for a lot of its foods. The menu at this restaurant is very broad.


