June Speaker – David Schwartz



David Schwartz

David Schwartz is a leading earthquake geologist. After 33 years at the US Geological Survey he retired from his full-time position in October 2017 but remains an active voice in Bay Area earthquake hazard circles as an Emeritus Scientist with the Survey.

David is credited with having pushed forward the fields of earthquake geology and paleoseismology (the study of prehistorical seismic events). One of his major contributions is the characteristic earthquake recurrence model, which has become a cornerstone of many seismic hazard analyses. He headed the San Francisco Bay Area Earthquake Hazards Project, co-chaired the Working Group on California Earthquake Probabilities that issued the first major Bay Area 30-year earthquake forecast, and was as a member of the Science Review Panels for the 2008 and 2013 Uniform California Earthquake Rupture Forecasts and the most recent (2014) earthquake probability estimate for the Bay Area. In addition, he twice served as the Northern California Regional Coordinator for the USGS National Earthquake Hazard Program.

David has traveled extensively outside the U.S. studying faults that have produced large historical earthquakes including Mongolia, Tierra del Fuego, northern Peru, Italy, Guatemala, and central Alaska. His current research remains focused on active faults and seismic hazards in the Bay Area, Alaska, and the Intermountain West.

His first job after graduation was for PG&E where he worked for 16 years as a Construction Engineer supervising construction projects and then another 16 years as a Procurement Specialist, writing and administering contracts for environmental and engineering consulting services.

When he wasn't working or bowling, together Gary and Tina have traveled to several European countries. France, Germany, Italy, Austria and Hungary are favorites, drawn there by the culture, the music and the friendly people. On their bucket list is a trip to Scotland and maybe Japan also. Truth be told, their son, Matt, has been an inspiration for their many trips abroad. Matt organizes the trips for them borrowing from his experience traveling to many of these same locations.

But it's the bowling where Gary has earned his most fame. He carries around a 220 average most years and has rolled **32 perfect games**!! For those of us novices, a perfect game is a score of **300**. To compliment that, even more difficult, Gary has rolled **13 '800 series'** which is a combined score for 3 games.

He participates in 3 bowling leagues that bowl 32-35 weeks/year. He also competes in 10-12 SIR bowling tournaments each year hosted by SIR Branches, including Branch 19. He has given back to his league and tournament bowing by serving as a league president for five (5) years and is the current Vice Chairman/Secretary of the SIR State Bowling Committee.



<u>The Cobra Experience</u> is a 25,000-sf museum located in Martinez, California, and showcases original Cobras, Shelby Mustangs, Daytona Coupe, GT40, King Cobra, Sunbeam Tigers and a Lotus. Currently, there are 24 cars on display. In addition, there are engine and wheel displays, posters, photos and a shop scene at it was at Shelby American in the 1960's. 
