

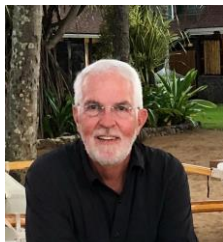

Of course sometimes we each may have other activities outside of SIR such as doctor appointments, travel plans, or illness that keeps us from being together on the first Thursday monthly. That's completely understandable. Nevertheless, we would like to see several more SIRs and guests each month at The Greenery. We haven't seen some of you since 2020!!

Some of the other SIR branches in California have an older membership with median ages of 80+. These older branches have fewer men that are able to volunteer serving as Leaders or remaining involved in their monthly activities. Often the more elderly branch members stop recruiting new and younger men to join in the activities each month. I have heard it said, "*I don't really know very many younger men, all my friends are older like me.*" Remember, we were younger men when we were recruited to join Branch#19 originally.

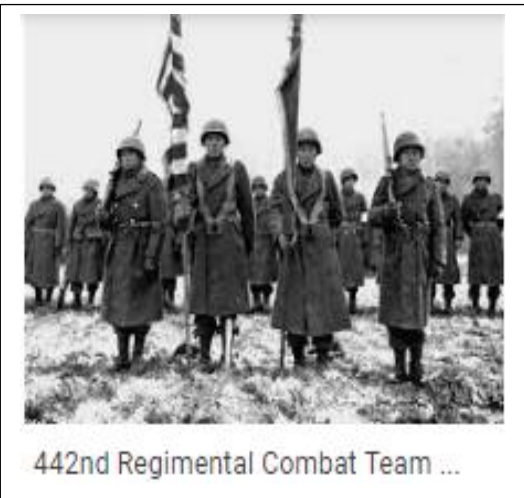


AMERICA'S CONCENTRATION CAMPS
The Japanese American Experience
During WWII

Eighty years ago, one of the darkest chapters in American history took place! The evacuation of over 110,000 Japanese and Japanese Americans. They were sent to 10 concentration camps (later called internment camps) for what the government called "their own protection".

Sir Milt Momita and his family were among the 1,500 Japanese and Japanese Americans from Imperial County, Ca. who were the first to relocate to Poston, Az. in May of 1942. They were in Poston from that time until their release in November of 1945. His presentation will cover events leading to this great injustice. He will present information of events before Pearl Harbor, the evacuation and life in the Camps, and a brief history of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team (the most decorated unit in the history of the US Military for its size and length of service.)

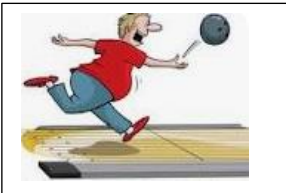

The Hornet also picked up the Apollo 11 astronauts after they splashed down 900 miles from Hawaii on July 24, 1969.

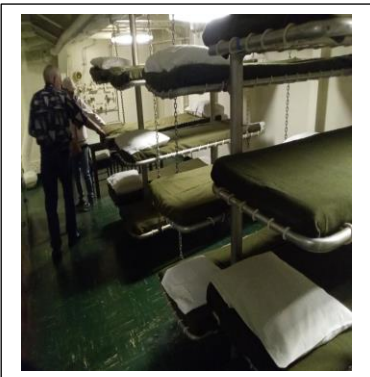

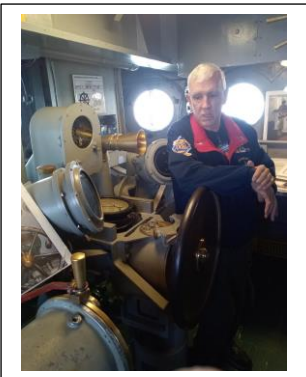
Apollo 11 test module (similar to the one retrieved)



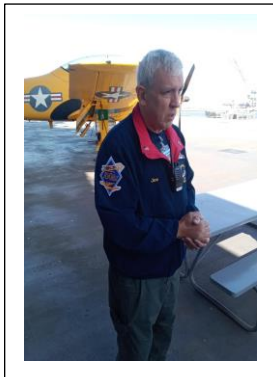

SIR Walking Tour of Historical Downtown Clayton



Please join us for a walking tour of Historic Downtown Clayton on **Saturday, May 21, 2022.**

Joel Clayton, founder of Clayton, California was born in the mining village of Buxworth, England, probably in 1812. In 1837, at age 25, Joel left England and came to America. Joel's travels brought him and his family to the Diablo Valley in 1842 where, in 1857, he founded and laid out the town of Clayton. In 1864, fire destroyed almost all of downtown Clayton, but by 1872 it was largely re-built, appearing much as it does today.

Our walking tour will be led by Adela Oldford, Special Tours Coordinator of the Clayton Historical Society, who will share with us her insights into the history and significance of many of the sites and structures still standing today.

We will meet at the Clayton Historical Society Museum at 10:30 AM for a ninety-minute walk. There is no cost for the tour, but a \$5.00/per person donation to the Society is requested. **Spouses, partners, and friends are welcome to join.**

Our tour will be followed by lunch at La Veranda, where separate checks are allowed.

SIR Visit to the "Cobra Experience"



Please join us for a visit to The Cobra Experience on Saturday, **June 18, 2022 at 10:00 AM.**

In the 1960's, the Shelby Cobra captured the hearts and imagination of car racing enthusiasts. Carroll Shelby, the facilitator of the famous Shelby Cobra, GT40, Daytona Coupe, and the GT350, amongst others, campaigned cars from 1962 to 1968 at Shelby American in Southern California. These cars remain giants for their contributions to the evolution of the muscle car industry in this country.

The Cobra Experience is a 25,000-sf museum located in Martinez, California, and showcases original Cobras, Shelby Mustangs, Daytona Coupe, GT40, King Cobra, Sunbeam Tigers and a Lotus. Currently, there are 24 cars on display. In addition, there are engine and wheel displays, posters, photos and a shop scene at it was at Shelby American in the 1960's. Unique to the museum is a 40-seat surround sound theater which features a HD film about the cars, Ford Motor Company and the Shelby American story. (Visit them at cobraexperience.org).

Our VIP Tour will begin at 10:00 AM with an 18-minute movie, followed by a guided tour of the museum. The visit will last approximately two hours. A 30-person minimum is required for the private tour. **Spouses, partners, family and friends are all invited to join.**

Admission is \$15.00 per person and can be paid at the door on the day of the event.

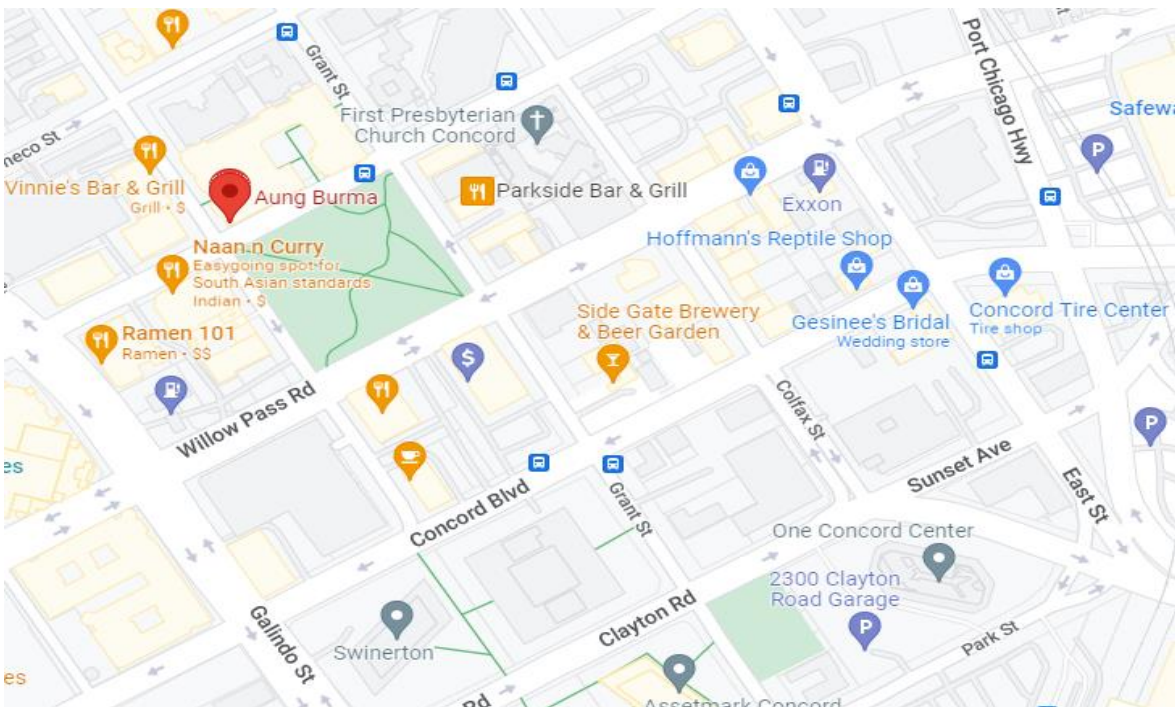

Trout and halibut are our spring catch. 8 of us went to New Melones for two days, and caught many nice surprise black bass, 16 kokanee, and 11 trout. The group had a great time. Lee Clark, Gordon Linebaugh, and Carl Moyer all got halibut on party boats in the bay. We did get some trout from San Pablo Reservoir. Stan Wong caught stripers in the delta and from shore in Benecia. Salmon fishing started well, but the fish are far out, and rough water kept us from them. When the boats go they are doing well with fish to 12 lbs. We have great expectations. Rockfish also started, but again we did not partake. Despite that, we have high hopes.
