




November Speaker - Duffy Jennings









Duffy Jennings compiled a distinguished career in communications over five decades as a journalist, publicist, corporate communications executive, public relations consultant, magazine publisher, freelance writer, and author.

As a prize-winning writer for the San Francisco Chronicle in the tumultuous 1970s, Duffy's coverage included the Zodiac and Zebra serial murders, the City Hall assassinations of Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk, and the Patty Hearst kidnapping. His reporting on the subsequent murder trial of the City Hall killer, former Supervisor Dan White, was submitted for Pulitzer Prize consideration. Veteran actor Adam Goldberg portrayed Duffy in the 2007 film, "Zodiac."

After his newspaper career, Duffy served as vice president of public relations for the San Francisco Giants from 1981 to 1993. Later he held roles as vice president of the Silicon Valley Leadership Group and Joint Venture Silicon Valley, founder and publisher of Los Gatos Magazine, and principal of his own public relations consultancy.

Jennings has published two books, his 2019 memoir, Reporter's Note Book: A San Francisco Chronicle Journalist's Diary of the Shocking Seventies, and as co-author with retired SFPD detective Frank Falzon of San Francisco Homicide Inspector 5-Henry-7: My Inside Story of the Night Stalker Case, City Hall Murders, Zebra Killings, Chinatown Gang Wars, and a City Under Siege, published in 2022.

Duffy is a San Francisco native who attended Lowell High School and earned his BA in journalism from San Francisco State University. He lives in Danville with his wife, Bonnie Becker.

6. Poker




