FISHING- edbush@gmail.com Captain Ed is impatiently waiting for a break in the weather, sea conditions and clarification of California fishing regulations. Blustery winds and large swells do not make good fishing. Currently the only legal fishing is for Sand dabs and flatfish (halibut and flounder). It is hopeful that rockfish and ling cod seasons might open on April 1st. Be sure and refer to CDFW regulations before heading out. If still unsure, check with Sir Ed Bush. Meanwhile, when the tides and swells cooperate, you can still fish for surf perch from the shoreline of Monterey Bay.

CORNHOLE— We have a NEW ACTIVITY available for our Branch 20 members! Cornhole is a very popular game these days. It is played much like horseshoes, with players tossing bean bags at a target board that has a hole it it. Scoring is simple—3 points for a bag that falls through the hole and 1 point for any bag that lands on the board.
