

BIG SIR JEFF USTICK SEZ:



From connecting people with nature through writing, art, or exercise, the Redwood Rx program, organized by the Mountain Parks Foundation in partnership with California State Parks, has another slate of unique forest activities to participate in this summer and fall.

Now in its second year, Redwood Rx was inspired by research showing that spending time in nature improves mental and physical health and invites people to interact with nature in unique ways.

"We were thrilled with the overwhelmingly positive response to our Redwood Rx program when we unveiled it to the public last year," said Mountain Parks Foundation Director Brenda Holmes. "2024 marks Redwood Rx's 2nd season, and we have expanded our line-up to include more classes, additional workshop leaders and brand new offerings like Forest Qi Gong and Walk with a Doc. Hearing how much these experiences are resonating with people and about the positive impacts time in nature is having on their wellbeing is one of the highlights of my job."

The program's first Walk with a Doc activity was held July 21 at Henry Cowell Redwoods, but there is another coming up August 17. The approximately 1.5 mile walk and talk is intended for all ages, is free to attend and will start with a discussion about evidence-based lifestyle approaches that help prevent chronic disease and improve health.

Nine Sir's met at our regularly scheduled wine gathering on Thursday July 19 at Big Sir Jeff Ustick's home. The theme for July was "White Wines NOT Chardonnay or Sauvignon Blanc"... and what a variety of white wines it was.

California whites (Bargeto Viogner and Fetzer Riesling, a German Von Winning Riesling, a Spanish blend-Lagranje Verdejo/Viura, two French selections— Foncastel Picout de Pinet Languedoc and Chateas de Vimont Graves, a Sicilian Zabibbo-Catarratto by Stefano Di Blassi and a Portuguese Vinho Verde by Portal de Vinha were all savored along with a selection of cheeses and crackers, nuts and other delectables.

The most surprising wine of the afternoon was a 2005 bottle of Treana Marsanne/Viognier brought by Sir Joe Mingione. White wines are usually enjoyed at a much younger age, and this bottle's cork had dried out a bit, but we were all amazed at how well this aged blend held up. As it sometimes turns out, older is better!

Our next gathering will take place on Thursday, August 15, the day after our August luncheon. The theme will celebrate a local wine celebrity... Pinot Noirs of the Central Coast! PLEASE NOTE, WE ARE MOVING OUR START TIME TO 1:30 PM. Join us in enjoying the camaraderie of your fellow Sirs.
