PROGRAM

Our speaker for March 13 is Mike Fresco who retired from Hollywood with 12 producing and 56 directing credits for many of the most popular shows on television, including Northern Exposure and Murder One.

BIG SIR JEFF USTICK SEZ:

With March, we celebrate the beginnings of spring on the 19th. Spring usually denotes change and the emergence of new possibilities. While thinking about those possibilities, especially as I look at new growth in gardens, woods and forest surrounding us, I also reflect on events and changes in the past. March is the 3rd month of our Gregorian calendar as well as the earlier Julian calendar, although the Julian 3rd month was know as Martius, named after the Roman God of war, Mars. The essence of war has always been struggle and a resulting change.

On March 1, 1781, a formal ratification of the Articles of Confederation was announced by Congress. Under the Articles, Congress was the sole governing body of the new American national government, then consisting of the 13 original states. The Articles remained in effect through the Revolutionary War until 1789, when the U.S. Constitution was adopted. However, the Constitution did not guarantee rights for all, including women.

March is now National Women's History Month, having begun in 1857 when female textile workers marched in protest of unfair working conditions and unequal rights for women. What followed, and continues today, is a consistent attempt to create equality and opportunity for all. This movement has not always experienced progress. In 1913 a women's suffrage march in Washington D.C. was attacked by angry mobs while police stood by. The struggle for equality and opportunity continued following the adoption of the 19th Amendment in 1920 but challenges remained. In 1972 the Equal Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was passed by the U.S. Senate and sent to the States for ratification.
