BIG SIR COMMENTS

Dear Fellow Members of Branch #20.

In many parts of the world, September can be an ideal time of year with respect to climate and not being overly busy.

Historically significant events during the month of September include a couple of countries claiming their independence after having been colonized for many years. On September 18, 1810, Chile claimed its independence from Spain after 269 years. After being a colony of Portugal for 322 years, Brazil claimed its independence on September 7, 1822. Being a child of a Dutch father and an Indonesian mother, I'm reminded of the many years Indonesia was a Dutch colony starting in the 1600's, ultimately gaining its independence in 1945.

On September 9, 1776, the Continental Congress changed the name of the new American nation from the United Colonies to the United States. On September 25, 1789, the first U.S. Congress proposed 12 Amendments to the Constitution. Ten of those Amendments were ratified and make up the Bill of Rights.

Other significant events were on September 26, 1984, Britain agreed to allow Hong Kong to revert to Chinese sovereignty in 1997. On September 12, 1990, a treaty was signed by East and West Germany, and the Allies of World War II, re-unifying Germany.

Besides both mine and my wife's birthdays, notable birthdays in September include boxing champ Rocky Marciano, composer George Gershwin, American writer F. Scott Fitzgerald, and one of my favorites, puppeteer Jim Henson who created the Muppets. Just a few of his famous creations include Kermit the Frog, Miss Piggy, Big Bird, the Cookie Monster, and Bert and Ernie.

Enjoy the beginning of our Autumn season on September 23rd.



This year we have 12 different courses we play on. We had a note worthy achievement by one of our players, a 20 handicapper. On


the back nine at Pacific Grove, he had eight pars and one bogie, for 36, 45 on the front. There is always hope!






