NEW Email RSVP PROCESS

In April we initiated an e-mail-based system for checking on lunch attendance. Thanks to the 75% of active SIRs who responded to the invitation, and thanks also to our now-retiring Telephone Callers for your service in the past!

We'll be using the same process in May and looking for an even higher response rate. Here's how it will work:

On Monday, May 2nd, all SIRs who have email will get an electronic invitation from "SIR Santa Cruz". You'll need to click on the link in the email, which will open a browser window. Read the invitation, respond "YES" or "NO", add additional guests if applicable and optional comments, then hit the "Reply" button to complete the process. If you access email on your smartphone, it'll work there too.

SIRs without email will still receive a phone call. If you do have email but for some reason you don't see the invitation, please let me know.
