SIRs makes for a great day. It's all about having a little fun in our retirement life.

This brings up the subject of membership. To meet our goals for continued and improved membership, all of us need to spread the word of all the activities and good fun we are having. It just takes a few words from a SIR to make it happen.

One other matter, before I get off the soapbox. I'd like to echo Jim Bunker's and our Big SIR's concern about meeting attendance. In addition to finding new members you need to keep Branch 20 strong by attending the meetings.

ATTENDANCE AT LUNCHEONS—JIM BUNKER

Last month's (May) Luncheon meeting saw 45 SIRS show up out of 110 members- 41%. The worst ever show of support for your Branch 20. We usually have at least 60 plus or 55% in attendance.

The lack of attendance has consequences, the Caterer who has fixed costs may see the price charged for lunch as inadequate to cover these costs. The 2 buck bucket drops along with the 50/50 raffle. These support the costs involved in running your Branch 20.

With the EVITE system it has become too easy for members to just hit the NO not attending without having to make up some excuse as why they are not attending. There are members that don't respond to their EVITE and have to be called on Saturday or Sunday. Of those that are EVITED or called, a large number don't respond to either. This creates a lot of work for others in getting the count right for the luncheon. This makes for a two tiered system of Calls and EVITES-again- more work for others.

Some members who manage to attend 75% of the Monday Golf tournaments have not attended any Luncheons this year, while others in this group have missed 3 and 4 lunches.

A member who fails to attend 3 consecutive luncheon meetings or has failed to attend 6 regular luncheons may be dropped from
