He uses a mold to form the body then applies up to 300 spines on each one. After a bisque firing they are layered with 6 coats of glaze and fired again at 1650 degrees. The 8"x8" clever pieces are now in 15 different countries and more than 20 states. Jerry has graciously donated two of his prize Sea Stars to our SIR group for prizes:
