Fishing with SIR Ed Bush on the Miss Molly- by Joe Mingione

Thanks go to Ed for the invitation to go salmon fishing. I know Ed has the sign-up list of interested fishermen and from what he tells me, I'm the 4th SIR to go out. He has a sturdy 30ft boat and all the right equipment: Radar, Satellite and double

Yamaha outboard engines.



Ed has a down-rigger that lowers the line to the best depth. Using Ed's hand made rods, we caught ours at about 110 feet trolling at 2 knots when we got the BIG pull on the line (it wasn't jellyfish or kelp this time). We were out about 12 miles from the SC Boat Harbor. Weather was fairly calm and the water was choppy by not bad. We caught a big one 24 pounds, 32

inch King Salmon (no fisherman BS).



Ed likes to go out early in the morning, around 6am, and return when he catches the limit of 2 salmon per fisherman (20 inch minimum) or after 3-4 hours, before the wind kicks up and white caps appear. Before choosing his fishing day, Ed checks the forecasted weather and ocean currents.

If you get the opportunity to go out— take it! Even if the fish aren't biting, the setting is beautiful with diving pelicans and healthy air all around you.
