GOLF:

OTHER ACTIVITIES:

Special Events:

Giants Game: Big Sir Greg Hood coordinated a trip to the Giants / Padres game on May 25. This is the fourth year that we have had this opportunity, and all the tickets were sold. There were 56 people on the trip, including members, spouses, and friends. There was an issue with the time it took for the bus return to Sacramento, which will be a consideration for future decisions on this activity.

Dante Club Events: Primarily through Branch 23 member, Rich Battistessa, a member of the Dante Club board, and in coordination with Tom Novi, we were given an opportunity to attend three Dante Club events that are available to the public. These included a cioppino dinner in March, a wine tasting in May, and a golf tournament in August.

Music Circus: Tom Novi coordinated our attendance at a Broadway Musical, õFantasticsö, followed by an optional dinner at Hot Italian restaurant in midtown. Approximately 40 people attended the event in April.

Ladies Day Lunch: For 2016, it was decided that the traditional Ladies Day Lunch would be moved from the Elks Club to the Red Hawk Casino in Shingle Springs. It was held on December 14, and was quite well attended. A total of 72 people made the trip, with 38 taking the bus, and 34 driving their own cars. We were provided our own room for a buffet luncheon, and were able to enjoy all the activities of the Casino. By show of hands, a reschedule of the event in 2017 was strongly recommended.

Annual Picnic: The picnic at Carmichael Park was held on May 17 for the fifth year, attended by about 70 members, spouses and guests. Again, the food and cooking were all handled by Paul Joyce and his wife, Mary. In addition to the excellent food, Gary Bradley conducted a golf chipping contest, and Tom Novi ran a spirited bingo game. The participation was less this year than in previous years, and the BEC will be having discussions in 2017 for possible changes to improve the participation.

Photo Contest: Past Big Sir Dick Crippen, for the second year, has coordinated a branch photo contest; open to all branch members and their significant others. In May, the BEC approved a prize fund of \$200 for the contest, which included three categories: Portrait, Architecture, and Nature. Prizes were awarded to the top three in each category, based on a vote count of members at the August lunch, and the first place winner in all three categories was new member, Rich Singer. Others who won prizes included John Moist, Paul Joyce, Paul Domyancic, Joe Sandhu, and Greg Hood.

Book Exchange: This program is continuing in its fourth year, and is very popular. However, it resulted in the issue of more books being brought in than taken out, which made it very difficult for the branch personnel to handle the storage and display of the books. Fred Lythgoe took over management of the book exchange at the end of 2015, and has dealt with the excess book issue by giving them to the Bookworm used Book store in Carmichael. This effort has resulted in our branch having an account with the Bookworm that allows any of our members to buy books at half price, with the other half taken from our account. In August, the account had a balance of \$355. In addition, Fred has coordinated a program with the Bookworm to allow the branch to purchase gift certificates at half price, with the other half taken from the account when the certificate is redeemed. The branch bought ten certificates to use as door prizes at lunch during the holidays, and it will be decided in 2017 between the BEC and the Bookworm if the certificate program will continue.

Horseshoes: Our horseshoe competitions were continuing at the Elks Club after the normal luncheon, but were only held a few times due to weather problems and lack of players. The activity was suspended indefinitely in October, pending improvement in participation.

Bocce Ball: Little Sir David Peterson continued in his effort to create an active Bocce Ball competition after lunch using the Elks Club court. Efforts underway to organize a work party to refurbish the Elks Club court were cancelled when David Peterson experienced a serious illness in May. Carroll Hamon took over the effort and a work party did refurbish the court in August. Monthly play started in September, with just enough players to conduct the competition. It is still hoped that as more members learn about the sport that the activity will become very popular and competitive.

Inter-Branch Activities: There are other activities that are conducted in coordination with other branches or opportunities that are made available through the state or individual branches. Some of these include:

Travel: We no longer maintain an active travel program in the branch. Travel opportunities are published in the Nugget each month and the state publication, *Sir* Happeningsø advertises for commercial tours and cruises, some of which are targeted specifically for SiR. In 2016 we were specifically invited by SiR Branch 22 in Turlock to participate in a cruise of New England and Canada in October, 2016, and a cruise in the Netherlands and Belgium in April, 2017

Bridge: Several of the branch members participate in bridge groups that are combined with other local branches, and periodically will notify the membership through the Nugget when groups are expanding or need new members.

Fishing: Our participation in SiR fishing activities is available through two local inter-branch groups, *-*Jolly Hookersøin Rancho Cordova, and *-*Wheels and Reels, in Citrus Heights.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS: The following discussion highlights some of the significant events in 2016 for SIR Branch 23.

Ladies Day Lunch: The branch has traditionally held a formal lunch at the Elks Club in December for the members and their wives or significant others. The lunch included dinner and dancing, with live entertainment, beautiful table decorations, and prizes to commemorate various events such as milestone wedding anniversaries. It has been a special event over the years, but has experienced a steady decline in attendance over the last few years. With hopes of improving participation, the Branch Executive Committee decided that the 2016 Ladies Day Lunch would be held at the Red Hawk Casino in Shingle Springs.

Illnesses of Board Members: Little Sir David Peterson experienced a serious blood related illness in May. The illness required extensive hospitalization with large requirements for blood transfusions. Members were requested to make blood donations; very many responded

and are still do so. Director Paul Elkins stepped in immediately to replace David as the Little Sir, and Carroll Hamon took over his duties as the Bocce Ball chairman. Later in the year, Paul Elkins was hospitalized for a serious heart ailment, and the newly nominated Little Sir for 2017, Ray Zelinski, took over the duties for Paul. In addition, Paul Domyancic came on to fill Paul Elkinsøvacant director position, and Don Landsittel came on to fill the vacated position of Assistant Treasurer. The latter three men will all continue in these duties in 2017. In addition, Attendance Chairman David Nemzek suffered a stroke in March, and Tam LeFebure took over that responsibility until David was able to return to them by the end of the year. It is heartening to see the compassion in our branch for the well being of our members, and the dedication of our members to ensure our branch functions and traditions continue in times of need.
