LITTLE SIR REPORT by DAVE PETERSON

"COURAGE IS RESISTANCE TO FEAR, MASTERY OF FEAR------NOT ABSENCE OF FEAR:" Mark Twain



In the early hours of November 8th 2018; the news alerted us that a fast moving fire in Butte County was about to consume the rural town of Paradise. Many tragedies took place in the ensuing days of that fire which was contained on November 25, 2018. On May 8th, 2019 Branch 23 was treated to a well structured account of the Camp Fire by our guest speaker Alan Thompson. Alan, a former Satellite Internet Field Engineer and HAM operator; utilized on site reporting, photos and a clear understanding how the Camp Fire grew to a cost of \$17 billon, 86 fatalities, and consumed 18,804 buildings. Alan was directed to the fire to save, rebuild, and utilize portable equipment to keep cell traffic operable; which became vital to the rescue and evacuation needs. Alan discussed his years as a polished Toastmaster, Fire Hazard studies conducted in 2005, code changes in 2009, which included the shrinking of exit routes and overstressed evacuation routes. Alan ended with an evaluation that reveals the shortcomings of the cell phone as the primary communication tool for future natural disasters. Changes are needed.
