

#### LITTLE SIR REPORT:

Our May speaker is Joe Winkle, who is a volunteer docent on the USS Potomac, located at Jack London Square in the Oakland area. He serves as a docent for all of the Potomac's various activities, including dockside tours, Bay cruises, student tours, private charters, and also guest speaking appearances.

Mr. Winkle is going to tell us about the life of the USS Potomac, from its start as a Coast Guard cruiser to becoming FDR's very prestigious floating White House on Potomac Bay. Later the ship was bought and sold several times, variously used by famous people such as Elvis Presley, drug smugglers, and eventually falling into disuse and disrepair. Then it was rescued from being destroyed and now being restored as a national treasure.

Mr. Winkle retired from IBM in 2000, but continued to work in the technology industry until he retired again in 2010. He also volunteers at the San Leandro Police Department and is a member of the San Leandro Historical Railroad Society.

He served 4 years in the US Navy as an electronics technician on the destroyer USS McKean (DD-784), serving off the coast of Vietnam in 1964-1965.

Mr. McKean has 2 grown children and 3 grandsons. Five years ago he married Diane Beardsley, who is also a docent on the USS Potomac. They met as volunteers aboard the Potomac and were married on the ship by a USS Potomac Captain.
