
POOL CLUB



The weather was spectacular and we couldn't ask for better conditions. Dry trails except for a small stretch of muddy trails we had to



dodge. Temps were 65 at 10am start to 79 at 1pm finish. There was a large group of people all walking one direction so we walked that wayt towards the Deer Hollw Farm. There is a large barn and outside corralled area that had all the animals on full display: cows, goats, sheep, long hair pigs, and hens and roosters. The Farm was picturesque set inside the forest of tall pines, oaks and madrones. After a short visit we set out from our hike even though we were already a mile into it already. We walked anther mile and a half on level packed dirt trail amidst the lush green forest providing lots of shade, alongside a full and rapid flowing creek. The air was cool and full of pure oxygen. We climbed up anther 550 feet to the top ridge via Wildcat Loop Trail. At the top we come on to High Meadow Trail where after a short hike there was a great vista point, with benches, where we stopped to admire the full vista of Silicon Valley with views of the North, East and South. The full vista views of our great Bay Area was a true rush of adrenaline. Temperature was about 74 with a slight 3mph breeze and crystal clear blue skies. Heaven! It felt like Hawaii! We stopped to sit on the benches to enjoy the views while we hydrated with water and snacked on fruit. Bernie Coullahan shared his own backyard dried apricots and persimmons. Mmmmm! Thanks Bernie!! We walked along the ridge for 2 miles more and then proceeded downward and finished off at the parking lot 3 hours after our start in a total 5.6 mile hike.
