While working George coached Little League Baseball for 5 years earning one championship and was also involved with the Daly City Chess Club, serving as President.

George says, “My best move was marrying my beloved wife Lynne, my right arm through thick and thin”. We traveled extensively, but our real joy was raising three children we are very proud. of”. George and Lynne worked many jobs before and after retirement including Fuller Brush sales, running a press, at H & R Block and as a licensed Tax Preparer, and selling home improvements for Sears. George loves music and played Bass and Rhythm guitar in a trio. As an example of George’s versatility, he wrote and published four books and is a member of the California Writers Club.
