Home Computer Warning

<u>Computer-</u> The Computer link on the main website page features the January edition of Bill Bromiley's Computer Newsletter. Interesting write-ups that we can relate to are described briefly below. Numbers are the paragraph numbers in the newsletter.

- **2. Tesla Roadster**. The newest creation can go from 0 to 60 in 2 seconds and can also drive from SF to LA and back on a single charge. And speaking of charges, it's only \$250K.
- **6. Robotic Birds.** This is a great idea. It's a drone with wings like a falcon and is currently being used by some airports with bird problems. One airport reports it not only cleared out all of the birds, but they never returned. Like all drones, it requires continuous monitoring and control by a human being.
- 11. What is 2-Factor Identification (2FA)? 2FA adds an extra layer of protection to the authentication process when you access your accounts or data. It requires users to provide a second piece of identifying information in addition to a password. Examples of 2FA include answering a question like "What was your high school mascot?" The article points out that most of the recent high-profile data breaches could have been prevented with this extra security protection and that 28% of Americans don't know what it is. This is surprising to me since most of my accounts have this feature, and when I log on, I have to provide personal information like my mother's maiden name or the name of the street I grew up on. The article goes on to provide user information on how to set up this feature.
