Mike Ammann, our luncheon speaker, was one of the most interesting speakers we've had. Mike is President and CEO of the San Joaquin Partnership here in Stockton. The mission of the Partnership is to improve the economic picture in San Joaquin County and, in particular, bring in new business. Some of the most striking facts Mike provided was the number of people commuting daily to Silicon Valley from Stockton and the surrounding area. It is estimated that over 70,000 commuters make the 2.2-hour trip over the Altamont Pass each work day morning and 7000 of these commuters take the evening. Altamont Commuter Express train (ACE) between Stockton and San Jose.



Remember, to access the website, just use the CTRL, click feature on the above link. If you can't do that, here's a couple of other ways.

WEBSITE 101

- (1) **Do it from your browser.** That's the program you use when you want to send, read, or write E-mail. Just bring up your E-mail program, then type in the above address (the one starting with http) and then hit the "enter" key on your keyboard. Voila! If you get the Port photos above, you're there.
- (2) Log on to the State website. Same method as #1 above only type in http://www.sininc.org and then hit the "enter" key. This brings up the State main page with all the pictures of happy men. Scroll down and click on Branch Websites, then click on Branch46 Stockton. And voila again!

And here's a time-saving method for future logons. Once you're on the website, be sure your arrow is on the main page and then right click. A list of things you can do will come up. Click on "Create shortcut". It will ask if you want the shortcut on your desktop. Tell them yes and voila!(#3), there's now an icon on your desktop you can click on to get to the website. It might be labeled with something starting with "http". Just click on this icon (one or two times) and up comes the website. You can also change the icon title by right clicking on it and then clicking on "Rename" from the list that comes up. (No charge for this)

The second article informs you as to how to tell if an E-mail is real – that is, did it really come from your bank saying your account is overdrawn? And by the way, please send your account number. This is called "phishing" and is one of many ways to get personal information. February Luncheon Happenings

The speaker for the February Luncheon was Michael "Mike" Amman who is the President and CEO of the San Joaquin Partnership. Mike gave an excellent presentation on the current and future economic picture for Stockton and San Joaquin County. The focus of the Partnership is business attraction into San Joaquin County and its seven incorporated cities of Stockton, Lodi, Manteca, Lathrop, Tracy, Ripon, and Escalon. Mike pointed out that San Joaquin County is a prime location for new



businesses due to the availability of affordable housing and also its established shipping capability including the Port of Stockton, two major railroads, two major highways, and the Stockton airport. The airport alone is a recognized prime location for shipping cargo throughout Northern California and also is one of eight locations in the U.S. where the Amazon Prime Air Boeing 767s operate.

Mike pointed out that there are over 70,000 workers currently commuting from San Joaquin County to Silicon Valley. Transportation methods include the Altamont Commuter Express (ACE) railroad, automobile, carpooling, and special busses provided by various Silicon Valley companies. He noted that approximately 7000 commuters daily use ACE. Because of this, the Greater Silicon Valley economic development program was created. The program's main goal is to assist expanding Silicon Valley companies to consider locating to a lower cost business and housing environment and reduce or eliminate their employee commute from San Joaquin county. Technical companies and company distribution centers that have already located in Greater Silicon Valley are Amazon's E-FullFillment Center, Smuckers, Tesla's advanced CNC manufacturing division, and Electronic Vehicles International EVI).

COUPLES BRIDGE

SIR couples get together twice a month at each other's homes to play Contract Bridge over a 5-month period. There currently are sixteen couples divided into two sections of 8 each. These five-month sessions are followed by a bridge luncheon, usually in January and July, where awards (\$) are given out to the winners from the previous session followed by a post-luncheon bridge tournament involving all couples. The luncheon for the fall session was held at U.J.'s on January 26. Results and photos follow.
