BIG SIR GREETING MARCH 2019

Important dates in March are the Branch Luncheon on the 21st, Daylight Savings Time on the 10th, and the beginning of Spring on the 20th. Daylight savings time is all right, but I'm looking forward to Spring - this cold weather is getting old. The February Luncheon was a very successful undertaking. We had 51 active members and 4 guests. This resulted in a 69% attendance of active members, one of the highest numbers we've experienced lately.

Speaking of attendance, be sure and read this edition's write up about the elimination of the inactive status for Sir members. The new status is Exempt which means a member can be exempt from monthly luncheon attendance but must contribute to the Branch quarterly assessment requirement from State. Therefore, everyone on the branch roster is counted as an active member and included in the quarterly assessment. Previously, members on inactive status were not included. The article in this edition describes the new Exempt status and lists the branch members who have either returned to active status, changed to exempt status, or resigned. The plus side of this situation is that our active membership has increased from 71 to 74 members. The write up in this Bulletin is titled "Inactive Status Eliminated".

In February, Little Sir Glenn Nellman and I attended a State Sir meeting in Walnut Creek for all of the SIR branches. The meeting essentially concerned what was going to happen this year in SIR and what we could do to increase our membership plus how to keep our existing membership. New members should be personally briefed on how the branch is run, what activities we have, and what is expected of them as new members. It was also announced that a program

has been initiated to reduce the number of State SIR rules and positions that no longer apply. Also a new SIR logo was presented which keeps the same Rooster image but changes only the accompanying description. "SONS IN RETIREMENT" has been replaced by "ACTIVITIES FOR MEN". Other new items include a contest for the best branch, a naming of an "unsung hero", and the establishment of a central source for apparel. More on the apparel source and our new Rooster in later editions.

Once again remember that the Ladies Day Picnic Luncheon Picnic is June 20, Check out the notice in this edition. Also, we're starting our recruiting drive for 2020 officers. Some have already volunteered so the key positions we now need filled are Little Sir and Treasurer. A write up in this edition titled "Wanted! for 2020" describes specific duties for each of these offices.

FEBRUARY LUNCHEON HAPPENINGS

The February luncheon was a resounding success from the standpoint of attendees, awards, speakers, and, of course, the Raffle winners. Photographs of the various individuals are shown below. Active branch member attendance was 69% which is higher than our last three luncheon meetings.

Jack Steigerwald was introduced as a new member, and he spoke briefly of his background both personal and as a neuropsychometrist for the U.S. Army. Further information on Jack is provided later in this edition under "ROSTER ADDITIONS. Bulletin editor Jack Lamberty was presented with a Senior Certificate for having reached the age of 90 years. Rick Kindle, Region 2 Director, was a guest at the luncheon and spoke of the urgent need for increasing our membership. Rick also congratulated us for bringing together the current slate of officers in December of last year. Additionally, Rick awarded Dave Derksen a Certificate of Appreciation for his work as Big Sir during 2018. Guest Paul Rutherford from the Lodi Branch spoke briefly and also reported that Norio Kawai from Branch 46 won his flight in a state Golf tournament for SIRS in the Monterey area and was awarded the jacket.

Our speaker for the luncheon was Bill Brennan who, among other things, was a submarine sailor during the cold war. Mr. Brennan's talk was highly entertaining, especially when he described certain aspects of his naval career. Bulletin space limitations prevent describing all the situations he found himself in but, to sum it up, he went from being continually seasick on his first ship to being assigned submarine duty where there was no seasick problem. In between ship assignments, he went to electronics school at Treasure Island, got married, and, on his honeymoon, drove across the U.S. and back in a "rusty"1953 Chevy. Some of his hilarious submarine adventures included sinking downward in a vertical position and being hit by their own torpedo (no warhead). Following his military service, he attended various colleges and eventually wound up as a Professor of Russian History at UOP. For this he had to learn to speak Russian and also to read German.

Inactive Status Eliminated

The SIR member status of Inactive which allowed a member to be kept on the Branch roles without the attendance requirement has been eliminated. (Rule 54 eliminated) The replacement is the status of "Exempt". In this status the member is a full member for which dues must be paid, but attendance is excused. The Branch 46 Executive Board agreed that if a member wished this status, he will pay \$10 (once a year) to cover his dues and some overhead. (Revised Rules 55 and 100)

The Branch 46 Attendance and Membership chairmen contacted 17 of the branch inactive members and gave them the choice of (1) becoming an active full member again, (2) becoming Exempt and paying the \$10, or (3) dropping their membership altogether. Of the 17 contacted, two elected to return to active status, five have chosen Exempt status and will pay the \$10, and nine have resigned. One member was not able to be contacted. Travel: Our bulletin is space limited, so the website has a complete list of SIR travel opportunities from March, 2019 thru September 14, 2020.

Computer: There are 13 articles in the March computer newsletter by Bill Bromily. The ones we found interesting are briefly described below. Just log on to our website, click on Computer and check out the articles. Be sure and click on the link referenced at the end of each article. The articles are summaries of all the information on the link.

6. Doorbells Have Eyes. Home Security Cameras. An incredibly popular home security device is the installation of a video doorbell at your home's front door. Some have installed such equipment on each exterior door of their home. The installation is simple and usually can be accomplished by the homeowner in less than an hour. Once installed, the doorbell detects motion, activates the internal video camera, and transmits a warning and the live video to one (or more) devices, like smartphones or tablet computers, via WiFi. Apparently, this creates possible legal problems such as false identification or invasion of privacy. The accompanying article discusses these situations and provides information about adjusting your doorbell to avoid some of these problems. This is recommended reading if you have one of these devices.

Editor's note: We have one of these doorbells and find it very useful. On Halloween night, we set it for continuous monitoring of our front porch and the approach region. Then we were able to see who was coming and going – just like sitting in a chair outside.

9. Francis Gary Powers U-2 Shoot Down Although this is not computer-related, I found the article very interesting. All of us are old enough to remember the May 1, 1960 shoot down over the Soviet Union (Russia) of a U-2 intelligence gathering reconnaissance aircraft piloted by Francis Gary Powers. Some aspects and details of the overflight mission are still undisclosed or in dispute almost 60 years later. Powers was held captive by the Soviets until February 1962 when he was exchanged in Berlin for a Russian spy, Rudolph Abel, held by the U.S.. Powers was discharged from the USAF and wrote a book about his experiences. This article provides a lot of information I didn't know; however, there is no information about Power's time and experiences as a prisoner in Russia.

Little Sir

On a more serious side, here are brief descriptions of some critical aspects of each position.

Little Sir

One of the main functions of the Little Sir is to provide a speaker for each of our monthly Branch luncheons. While this may seem to be a somewhat difficult task, it's really not. Stockton and the San Joaquin County have a wealth of individuals ready and willing to talk to us. The publicity is good for them individually and for the organization they represent. Also, previous Little Sirs can provide significant help and suggestions. The Little Sir also works side-by-side with the Big Sir during the two Ladies Day functions (June Picnic and Christmas) providing assistance with the setup, decorations, and the activities. He also substitutes as necessary whenever the Big Sir is not available.

Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for the Branch finances. Along with the Assistant Treasurer and Big Sir, he can make deposits and write checks on our bank account. At the luncheons, he is the one at the long table who sells the luncheon tickets and then pays Elkhorn based on the number of tickets sold. Other payments, to name a few, go to Elkhorn and Micke Grove for facility use, to our Bulletin publisher, and to the State office for our quarterly assessment (1.25 per member). He also takes in the money from the Bucket Brigade donations and the 50/50 activity. He completes Sir Form 28 each month which is an Excel sheet breakdown of all disbursements and receipts and then sends it in to the State Office.

General

All Officers and Directors are expected to attend the monthly BEC meetings which are held once a month a few days before the Branch luncheon. This is probably one of the most important functions of any Branch Officer or Director since it provides an open forum for discussion, complaints, new ideas, and anything else concerning the Branch. Any decisions made are voted upon and entered into the minutes. It should be noted that any member of Branch 46 can attend these meetings and participate in the discussions; however, voting is limited to officers and directors.
