## **SPEAKER FOR APRIL**

Our speaker for the April Luncheon will be Peter Grossgart, the Marketing Manager for the Port of Stockton. Mr. Grossgart's duties include planning, developing, and implementing the port's maritime trade and real estate business development efforts. He is also involved in customer service, relationship management, and marketing the port's services. Mr. Grossgart has more than 18 years of maritime industry experience and has worked for Swire Shipping as line manager for the West Coast North America service; country manager North America and at Marine Terminals Corp; and Ports America where he last served as VP-Sales for the USWC (Bulk, Breakbulk, and Military Division) He is a graduate of U.C. Davis with a BS in Managerial Economics and he has an MBA in finance from Golden Gate University. Mr. Grossgart also enjoys coaching several youth teams (basketball, baseball, soccer, and football) as well as volunteering for Habitat for Humanity and Ronald McDonald House.

## **March Luncheon Happenings**

The speaker for the March luncheon was Dennis Beasley, the Artistic Director for the Stockton Community Theater. Mr. Beasley grew up in Gilroy and did his undergraduate work at UCLA and received his graduate degree from U.C. Irvine. He has been a

freelance director and actor throughout California and then served Artistic Director SCT as artistic Director the Rochester Community Theater in New York. Coming back West, he was the marketing director at Western State in Salinas before coming to Stockton as artistic Director of the Community Theater.

Mr. Beasley spoke of productions coming in both 2018 and 2019. Some of the notable ones are "Hair", "Annie", "Ripcord", and "Nice Work If You Can Get It". Annual costs for the Community Theater is around \$600,000, and most of this is financed through donations and sponsors.

One of the largest costs is royalties on music and songs. As an example, royalties for Mary Popkins was around \$7500. Tickets run \$15 for children and \$22 for Seniors. Most of the shows are put on by outside production companies; however, the talent and performers are usually local and include performers from Delta, UOP and some of the high schools in Stockton. Mr. Beasley welcomes audition interested in theater to come and anyone at anv time.

<u>Computer-</u> The Computer link on the main website page features the April edition of Bill Bromiley's Computer Newsletter. There are sixteen write-ups this month which vary from the latest autonomous car reports to new features for your Apple watch. Interesting write-ups that we can relate to are described briefly below. Numbers are the paragraph numbers in the newsletter.

**1. Protecting your laptop.** If your laptop or desktop is stolen your data is not protected even if you have a strong logon password. The thief can, for example, remove your hard drive, mount it in another computer and he will have access to all of the data on your hard drive. The only thing you can do is encryption of all your data before your computer is stolen. It is simple to encrypt your data and it is automatic on most modern computers. The article walks you through the encryption process step by step.

**6. Do You Have a Landline Home Telephone? Bad news!** According to a US government study, 46% of American homes still have a landline telephone. Because the number of landlines is decreasing rapidly, companies are charging higher rates to sustain revenues. Good news! If the costs become prohibitive, you can switch over to Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) and use the internet system for your previous landline calls. You can still use the same phone number and the costs should be significantly less. The article at the link will help provide VOIP information and in some cases a VOIP vendor site where you can take further steps.

8. **Cellular Connections Between Future Cars.** Such communication is crucial because sensors being developed for autonomous cars can only detect the road environment within their lines of sight, but vehicle to vehicle (V2X) communications are expected to provide information on what lies beyond line of site and around the corner, whether there are icy spots, potholes, traffic jams, or even information on other vehicles that might do something dangerous, like running a red light. This critical information can be transmitted as often as 10 times per second.


