

# APRIL LUNCHEON HAPPENINGS

The speaker for the April Luncheon was Mr. Tod Ruhstaller, the CEO and Curator of the Haggin Museum in Stockton. Mr.



Ruhstaller lives in Stockton with his wife, Sandi. They have two daughters. Tod went to Stagg High School, then graduated from U.C. Davis with a B.S. and M.S. in Anthropology. This is his 34<sup>th</sup> year with the Museum.

Mr. Ruhstaller described the changes that are currently underway in the Museum's art collection - mainly a remodeling of the galleries. The tasks underway are in the areas of information, lighting, and location of the art in each gallery to provide an easier and more enjoyable walk-through. As an example, a picture will be relocated so that it provides an introduction to or compliments the succeeding picture. LED lighting has been installed throughout the museum which results in a better viewing experience. Information panels located on the walls along with the pictures are changed by reducing the amount of text and, in some cases, rewriting. Again, this will make the gallery walkthrough easier and more informative for the museum visitor.

The Haggin Museum has the largest J.C. Leyendecker Art Collection on public display in the world. Leyendecker was one of America's most popular commercial artists of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. He completed 322 illustrations for the Saturday Evening Post and also for Colliers and The American Weekly. Leyendecker was a mentor to Norman Rockwell who is well known for his Saturday Evening Post covers.

Other happenings at the luncheon include the introduction of David Stull as a new member to Branch 46. More information on David is given later in this edition under "ROSTER ADDITIONS". Also introduced was Mr. Ron Bryant, a transfer from Branch 106 in Suisun. Mr. Bryant will be introduced again at the May Luncheon when he becomes an "official" member.
