BIG SIR GREETING AUGUST 2019

However, there are some other important days — the Branch 46 Executive Committee (BEC) meeting on the 12th and the Branch Luncheon on the 15th. And our bulletin editor says the 19th is also a very important day because that's when all bulletin input is due.

At the August Branch luncheon, we will be voting on the slate of officer and director candidates for the year 2020. The list of candidates is in this bulletin and will be read off at the meeting. Also, the meeting will be declared open for additional nominations. If you know someone you think could fill one of the positions, please make the nomination. Additional candidates are very welcome since many of our current officer positions have been occupied by the same person for up to 6 years. If you do have a candidate, don't surprise him. Talk to him before you submit his name. If you have a willing candidate tell me or the Nominating Committee Chairman, Dave Derksen. We will get him on the final list before the luncheon. Also, we still have an opening for the 2020 Little Sir. The Bulletin Editor says we have 2 full page bulletin write ups on both this problem and our need to fill slots that have been occupied for several years.

Attendance at the July Luncheon was only 34 or 45% percent – the lowest percentage in the past 5 years. Our Attendance Chairman says that 41 members were absent, and only 12 were excused. Hopefully, this is not a continuing problem and is summer vacation related. Our speaker, Sally Snyde,

President of Worlds of Wonder in Lodi, put on an excellent, well-prepared talk and slide show. She supplied handouts which detailed the reasons and plans for expansion of the WOW museum. The plans are very ambitious and will take 5-6 years with a cost between 24 to 30 million.

Our current membership is 75 and represents an increase of 4 since the start of the year. Coincidentally, I just received E-mail from our Regional Director, Rick Kindle, who informed me that Stockton Branch 87 will be disbanding in December, and 3 members have already provided transfer requests to join Branch 46. Rick expects we will be receiving other transfers. Their membership as of yesterday was 23.

JULY LUNCHEON HAPPENINGS

Our speaker for the July Luncheon was Sally Snyde, President of the Worlds of Wonder Science Museum in Lodi, better known as WOW. She spoke about a relatively weak science curriculum not only in Lodi schools but throughout the Central Valley. In an attempt to reverse this trend, the WOW Science Museum was created in Lodi in 2010. The museum offers hands-on science-based exhibits and programs to stimulate science knowledge not only for elementary and high school students, but for all ages. The museum also provides Field Study Trips for preschool through 6th grade. Here each group has the opportunity to explore 70+ exhibits and enjoy a hands-on lesson in the WOW Laboratory.

The biggest problem according to Sally is the single classroom and laboratory in the museum. Field trips to the museum are very popular throughout the local area; however, because of the lack of space, only one field trip at a time is permitted and each trip must be scheduled significantly in advance. Because of the popularity of the Field trips, the schedule is completely full by March. The lack of space problem has resulted in the museum starting a major expansion which will result in the museum eventually occupying most of an entire city block in downtown Lodi. The completed facility will be able to serve 160,000 students compared to 70,000 served in 2018. The cost runs from 24 to 30 million dollars and is expected to take 5 to 6 years.

Currently, 75% of the income to the museum is earned (field trips and walk-in customers). 25% is from donations and grants. There is no income from any government organizations such as City, State or Federal. However, the city of Lodi is helping wherever it can such as expanding streets.

Sally welcomes donations and volunteers. Contact the museum if you're interested.

What it is - How to get there - What you'll find



Editors note: This page does not include the usual information about Bill Bromily's latest Computer Newsletter. The complete Newsletter is on our Branch website, and selected articles will appear in the September bulletin.

<u>What is it?</u> The Branch Website is a special internet site created to present detailed and thorough information concerning Branch 46. The Branch bulletin, which is sent to you every month, generally reports on what happened in the Branch in the previous months, what is coming next month, and what are the important, current items crucial to the branch. The branch could not function without the monthly bulletin, whereas the Website provides the viewer with all necessary information to describe the branch. It lists all the activities, who's running them, how to become involved. To do this it provides 10 separate links for the user to click on to read and learn about each activity including one which tells how to join the branch along with some good branch publicity.

How to get there. To log on or bring up the branch website on your screen, simply go to your browser (Internet Explorer, Google, or whatever) and type in: http://branch46.sirinc2.org then hit the "enter" button on your keyboard. Depending on your system, you may be able to simply hold down your "ctrl" key on your keyboard then double click on the underlined link provided here. The above artwork showing Hotel Stockton and the freighter should come up. Below this you will see a line listing each link which is available for your perusing. This is followed by text giving the history and general information of the State Sir organization and Branch 46. Now, click on any of the links to bring up the web page for the particular link you're interested in. Caution! When you're finished with the link, don't click the "x" on the page to get back to the main web page! This will take you back to your home screen, and you'll have to start all over to get back. Some of the links have a special link labeled "home" on the main page. Click on this to get back to the main web page. If there is no "home" link on the page, just click on the back arrow, usually in the upper left corner of the page.

What you'll find. Probably, the most used link on the website is the "Bulletins" link. Believe it or not, we have every Branch 46 bulletin from this month all the way back to January 2014 – 67 bulletins! Unfortunately, most of the bulletins up to 2018 are missing the back page – the one used for mailing and which also lists the current officers and chairmen for that particular month. Good news! We just found a relatively simple way to include this page, and all the 2019 website bulletins have it. And we're working on adding it to all previous bulletins. Due to space limitations, the regular monthly bulletin can only accommodate one page of usually one event; however, the photo link on the website usually contains all photos from any recent event where photos were taken. This will be 3-4 pages of a recent event such as the June Picnic, Christmas Luncheon, Romeo, or Couples Bridge Luncheons.. These photos are also stored on our computers, and if you should want a copy, just contact your webmaster.
