BIG SIR GREETING SEPTEMBER - 2017

As you know, SIR membership is declining locally and also throughout the State. Bringing in women would be one possible solution, so, at the last BEC meeting, it was decided to conduct a survey at our luncheon asking each member for his opinion on allowing women to join SIR. Of the 50 members at the luncheon, 30 responded with 17 in favor and 13 against. That's 57% to 43%, hardly a landslide. Written opinions ranged from "No. This is a men's social club" to "Yes. As long as they're under 50 and good looking".

Our thanks go to Paul Wagner who accepted the floor nomination for 2018 Branch Secretary. Since he's already our 2017 Secretary, there should be very little training involved. This leaves us with two openings in our 2018 Branch Officer slate – Treasurer and Little Sir. By the end of August we are required to send to State Form 20 listing Branch officers for 2018. This year the form will go in with blanks for Little Sir and Secretary. Once again I urge you to either step forward or let us know of someone you would recommend for either of these two slots. SEPTEMBER SPEAKER

The speaker for the August luncheon will be Mr. Wes Rhea, Certified Tourism Ambassador & Certified Destination Management Executive (CTA & CDME). Since 2011, Mr. Rhea has been the Executive Director of Visit Stockton, previously known as the Stockton Convention and Visitors Bureau. Visit Stockton was formed in 1979 and is the official destination marketing organization for Stockton. Visit Stockton is funded by the Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID), which is an assessment paid by hotels for overnight stays. The current budget is just over \$1.5 million. Visit Stockton has a team of 7 people and is located in downtown Stockton in the historic B&M Building at 125 Bridge Place.

Wes has been very active in the Stockton community serving our numerous boards and committees. Wes currently serves locally on the boards of United Way of San Joaquin (Past President/Current Secretary), the Stockton Historical Maritime Museum, the Downtown Stockton Alliance (Treasurer) and the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce (ex-officio). He was also a Past President of the Stockton Asparagus Festival. A leader in the travel and tourism industry, he is currently serving on the boards of the Western Association of Convention and Visitors Bureau's (past President), and the Central Vallev Tourism Association (past President). Wes resides in Stockton with his wife Kristi and sons Max and Jack.

From the Branch


Well, we don't want to kick anyone out, but members need to be aware that the most important SIR activity is not bowling, bridge, golf, or travel, but rather attendance at the monthly luncheon meetings. There are no dues for belonging to SIRs, but the organization does have expenses which are met by the voluntary contributions to the bucket at the monthly meeting. If you are not attending, you are probably not contributing to the bucket, which means that those who do attend are subsidizing your membership.

What you can do:

- 1. Attend the monthly luncheon meeting regularly.
- 2. If you find that you will miss a meeting, call the Attendance Chairman, Dick Andersen, 478-3753 prior to the meeting date.
- 3. Send in a contribution to the bucket brigade when you miss a meeting. Or double your donation at the next meeting.

August Luncheon Happenings

The speaker for the August Luncheon was Mr. Kelly Olds, the CEO of all activities at the San Joaquin County Fairgrounds. The fairgrounds occupy 252 acres which contain 60 structures and a total of 5 employees. Mr. Olds stated that the County Fair is only one of many activities that use the fairgrounds. In fact, during 2016, there was some type of event going on every day at the fairgrounds. Examples include the Asparagus Festival, boats, weddings, funerals, car shows, animal shows, and a five day kennel show. To sustain these activities, the fairgrounds must raise \$200,000 each month, and they receive only \$30,000 per month from the state.



Mr. Olds said that the state bureaucracy was one of the biggest problems in trying to run and also improve the fairgrounds. As an example, it required 2 years to get approval and funding for solar panels for some of the structures. On a lighter note, he told about a wedding that had been scheduled, then canceled. Then, the day before the original date, someone showed up to decorate the wedding area. They were told by the fairground people that someone had called and said the wedding had been canceled. They called the bride and she said no, the wedding was still on. The fairground scrambled, and the wedding took place the next day. It turns out the ex-wife of the husband-to-be had called everyone involved and said the wedding was off!

Other happenings at the luncheon included the annual election of the branch 2018 officers and chairmen. Paul Wagner was nominated and approved from the floor for branch secretary, and the 2018 slate as published in the August bulletin was approved unanimously. Still to be filled are the slots for Branch Treasurer and Little Sir.

A survey was conducted during the luncheon concerning admission of women to the SIR organization. "Ballots" were passed out to each table, and handed in at the end. 30 out of 50 attendees voted with 57% in favor and 43% opposed.

SIR license plates with the Branch 46 name on them were offered for sale during the luncheon. Paul Wagner conducted the sale, and orders were taken for 20 plates.

COUPLES BRIDGE

SIR couples get together twice a month at each other's homes to play Contract Bridge over a 5-month period. For this session there were sixteen couples divided into two sections of 8 each. These five-month sessions are followed by a bridge luncheon in January and July, where awards (\$) are given out to the winners from the previous session followed by a post-luncheon bridge tournament involving all couples. The luncheon for this spring session was held at U.J.'s on July 21. Results and photos follow.



Computer -The Computer link on the main website page features the September edition of Bill Bromiley's Computer Newsletter. Interesting write-ups that we can relate to are described briefly below.

#7 Roomba Floor Vacuum: Do you have one of those floor vacuums that automatically wander around your house, banging into walls and tables and collecting dust and debris? If you do, check the model #. Something I never thought about before is the tremendous financial savings, not necessarily due to increased manufacturing, but the fact that the company doesn't pay salaries, health insurance, or retirement benefits to the robots.
