- **1. ZOOM Video Conferencing Everything You Wanted and Need To Know** This is a detailed article about Zoom and how it is becoming the next communication platform.
- **2.** ULA and SpaceX Win Space Force Launch Provider Competition. These two companies have taken over all the government space programs, replacing the ones we used to know such as Boeing, Lockheed, and Martin,
- **3.** 15 Signs You've Been Hacked How To Fight Back. Space does not permit listing all possible solutions for the user if you are experiencing any of these signs. However, most include actions you should do immediately and also in the future.
 - 1. You get a ransomware message
 - 2. You get a fake antivirus message
 - 3. You have unwanted browser toolbar
 - 4. Your internet searches are redirected
 - 5. You see frequent, random popups
 - 6. Your friends receive social media invitations from you that you didn't send
 - 7. Your online password isn't working
 - 8. You observe unexpected software installs
 - 9. Your mouse moves between programs and makes selections
 - 10. Antimalware, Task Manager or Registry Editor is disabled
 - 11. Your online account is missing money
 - 12. You've been notified by someone you've been hacked
 - 13. Confidential data has been leaked
 - 14. Your credentials are in a password dump
 - 15. You observe strange network traffic patterns

SIR STATE HAPPENINGS (QUARTERLY NEWSLETTER)

The July 29th 2020 issue of the State quarterly newsletter is out and available for all to read. Just go to the State SIR website (http://www.sirinc.org/), scroll down and click on the "SIR Happenings" link, then click on "HAPPENINGS May 2020" This issue is very interesting. SIR State President Ed Benson's letter talks about continually engaging SIR members, the need to attend ZOOM meetings, and building SIR's public image. Regarding our public image, SIR has engaged MCO Associates, a highly recommended public image consulting firm in Sacramento to provide us with a plan.

Additionally, there are 38 pages of commentary, photos, reports from various branches, plus several pages of "Consumer Tips." Here some tips we found interesting and may be applicable to members of SIR.

- Page 33. False Products for Sale. Con artists love to take advantage of new health scares to cash in on public anxiety. There are 1000s of products being sold on line with claims that they help or can prevent Covid-19. These range from 'protective hats,' access to Beta tested vaccines to vitamins and supplements that can build your system to ward off virus infection. Snopes.com plus several others are listed as just a few good online sites that try to keep up with the fake claims.
- **Page 36. Hotel Concierge Tipping Info:** (You're not going to like this) Tip \$5 to \$10 for theater tickets or dinner reservations; \$20-plus for special services. Tip \$3 \$4 per night for Housekeeping Service. Leave cash daily on the desk or in front of the TV, and particularly at a time when you are sure your Housekeeper will be the first and only person to see it that day.
- **Page 37. Plastic Lens Care.** By law, all eyeglasses sold in the U.S. must be made of either high impact resistant plastic or tempered glass. Plastic is less expensive, easier to shape and lighter in weight. 90% of all eyeglasses are fitted with plastic lenses. These lenses should be cleaned with care as they are easily scratched even when coated with scratch resistant, protective coating. Never use any dry paper products not even Kleenex. And use these products in a wet or moist form so the fibers are soft enough to avoid scratching the lens surface. **Tip:** Premoistened Lens Cleaning Towelettes can be purchased in bulk packs of 120 for as little as 5 cents each.
- Page 38. Consumer Reports New CCR Feature: CR has just announced a new program that allows shoppers to get ratings and reviews on products by scanning the QR code on the product display materials or on the product for "brick & mortar" locations using your Smartphone camera. This code will also be displayed on web pages for online shopping websites. This feature was designed to assist the increasing population of online shoppers and combat fake online reviews and scams. This new CCR feature is available to all. Membership to CR is not required.
