

BIG SIR GREETING OCTOBER 2019

Welcome to October. Check out the calendar in this issue. Important dates other than the Branch functions are International Older Persons Day, National Golf Lovers Day, and Yom Kippur. These fit in well with the SIR organization. Columbus Day on the 14th is a Federal Holiday; however, not all states honor it. We recognize it as a no-mail Monday. And, of course, there's Halloween on the 31st.

Attendance for the September Branch Luncheon was 51 members or 65%, the second highest percentage this year. And our branch membership is now at 78. 2. Artificial Intelligence Program Beats Professional Cardplayers

Artificial Intelligence (AI) programs are being developed by technology experts around the world at an ever-increasing pace. The goal in every case is to have software that can control tasks that without AI require human input or, as a minimum, monitoring the task because of unpredictable issues that only a human brain can resolve. As an example, current focus in many AI laboratories is completely developing software for autonomous driving of vehicles in real driving settings. Resolving complex, unexpected issues while planning and executing success is often tested in card games. A new AI program that Facebook built with Carnegie Mellon University, called Pluribus, recently beat five poker professionals in a six-player Texas Hold'em tournament. After 10,000 hands, the system averaged profits of about \$1,000 per hour using \$1 chips, a "decisive margin of victory," according to a Facebook blog post."

14. Closer to a Blood Test Predicting When a Person Will Die

Researchers have been studying 44,000 healthy patients whose ages ranged from 18 to 109. The patients' overall health has been tracked for up to 16 years. The researchers report in *Nature Communication* that the patients' blood test were around 80% accurate in predicting mortality risk within five to 10 years. "The researchers analyzed a group of 226 so-called metabolites, or by-products of things that various cells and tissues in the body pour into the blood stream for circulation and removal. From this collection of markers, the team narrowed down the list to 14 that they determined could together, and along with the person's sex, provide a pretty good picture of each person's health risk, and, by association, their risk of dying in the next five to 10 years."

September Luncheon Happenings

Our speaker for the September Luncheon was Elbert Holman, a former city councilman, Vice Mayor, and a 20 year veteran of the SJ County Sheriff's Department. As if this wasn't enough, Mr. Holman is currently a candidate for County Supervisor in 2020. He had previously spoke to the Branch on the aftermath of Stockton's bankruptcy in 2008. This time he pointed out that the City of Stockton was recently rated #2 among financially sound cities in California.

The main topic of Mr. Holman's talk was his experiences as an investigator in the 1982 murders of Renee Rontal and Nancy Rubia, two 13-year-old Stockton girls whose bodies were found in a Delta ditch on Bacon Island west of Stockton. Two Stockton gang members were eventually located and convicted some 30 years later in 2015. Mr. Holman's investigation continued over the 30-year period with follow ups on various leads, interviews, and even a trip to the Mexican State of Durango where one of the suspects was reported living. This trip was not successful, but the suspect was eventually arrested in Tijuana. The murder trial lasted a year, and Mr. Holman said the main reason for the long trial was the fact that the suspects' defense lawyer, Richard Hawk, managed to effectively slow the proceedings. Hawk gained notoriety as one of the defense lawyers for Juan Corona who was convicted in 1971 of the murders of 25 farm laborers in Northern California.

Also, during the luncheon, three new members shown below were introduced, and their roster information is presented in this edition. Gene Campbell and Whitey Rasmussen are transfers from Branch 87.

Little Sir Rambling – UOP Women's Basketball for 2019

Lodi Branch 145 and Stockton Branch 46 are putting together a joint activity and we welcome participation by members of all other Branches. This November is the start of the college basketball season, and the University of the Pacific in Stockton will have a very good women's basketball team this year. Head Coach Bradley Davis will be our Luncheon speaker in October to tell us how the program is progressing. The Tigers were 19-13 last year and made the second round of the WNIT before losing to the eventual champions with only ten players on the roster. This season they already have been invited to play in the preseason WNIT to represent their conference and will have a first-round game at home on Friday, November 8 at 7PM that we are targeting for SIRS to get together to attend.

This year UOP will have a full 15 player roster which includes two five-star players, one of whom was the conference defensive player of the year last year. We also have a couple of fifth year transfers from Colorado State who played on championship teams and started most games, a 6'5" freshman center, the San Francisco player of the year in her senior year, one of the most highly touted point guards from Australia, a player from the French national team, plus a returning second team all conference forward, and a couple of returning 6'2" players as well as our returning best three point shooter. This is likely the deepest, tallest, and most talented roster ever at UOP. Players from Sacramento, Stockton, Manteca, and Turlock, as well as the Bay Area are on the roster.

This is not a sponsored event where you have to sign up and pay ahead of time for tickets. It is just a joint event and each Sir is responsible for their own transportation and ticket purchases. The Spanos Center on the JOP campus holds over 6000 and attendance at the women's college games usually don't run much over 1200. Tickets for seniors are only \$8 for regular games and may be a little more for a WNIT game. Tickets are good for any seat but those lower level folding seats in Section 1 at half court. The folding seat sections on either side are first come first serve other than season ticket holders. Bring wives, children and grandchildren if you like. The Tiger Dancers and Tiger pep band usually perform, and the Powercat Mascot is usually around for photo opps. We have heard interest expressed by members of Modesto, Turlock, and Sonora chapters so far.

If you have any SIR's gear you should wear it, and if we get enough Sirs attending the game we may get some recognition over the PA system and some contacts with the many seniors who attend the games.

We hope to see a lot of Sirs attending this game to root for our area players and what is likely the number one women's basketball team in the Central Valley this coming season.
