NOVEMBER LUNCHEON HAPPENINGS

Our November Luncheon speaker was Paul Wagner, current Branch 46 member and Past Big Sir, Little Sir, and Secretary.


Paul is a member of the Lions Club and every year, as a Lions representative, he travels south of the border to Mexico, Central America, or South America to provide donated eye glasses to the poor. The activity is called "Lions in Sight" and involves collecting used eye glasses in the California-Nevada area, processing them, and then distributing them to the communities south of the border.



The glasses go through several phases of preparation before being shipped out. This mainly involves determining the prescription of each set of lenses, labeling, and then packaging in accordance with the prescription. This is done with an optical camera device that can quickly scan a lens and determine the prescription. Paul showed photos of hundreds of boxes of these labeled lenses ready for shipping by boat to various locations.

Lions currently have clinics in 8 countries which are actually workshops with physicians, optometrists, and medical personnel. He showed photos of several locations where hundreds of people were lined up waiting to be examined. These workshops are able to handle up to 1200 people in one day.

Big Sir Dave Derksen announced that we now have full slate of Officers and Directors for 2019. He read off the names of the nominees which were


