8. Fast-growing Web of Doorbell Cameras

Internet connected video cameras in doorbells are one of the most rapidly growing devices in the marketplace. These cameras record a broad video view of any motion in the field of view of the camera, be the motion a person, animal or vehicle. This is transmitted to your smart phone where you can see and talk to whoever is on your front porch. Editor's note: We have one of these, and it does everything the article claims. I don't recall the installation charge, but we pay \$30/year now.

13. Stents and Bypass Surgery Are No More Effective Than Cardiac Drugs

Results of a large and long-awaited study show that for many heart disease patients taking cardiac appropriate drugs is as effective as invasive surgery to place stents or perform bypass procedures. The surgical procedures did outperform pills for patients suffering chest pain, but not all heart disease patients have chest pain.

November Luncheon Happenings

The speaker for the November Luncheon was Mrs. Jacqui Stevens, President of the San Joaquin Genealogical Society. Jacqui encouraged us to "find our roots", and her talk was mainly about methods to do this. She listed four personal requirements necessary to be successful. The first is (1) you need a curious mind (2) organizational skills (3) good networking skills and (4) cousins who have all the family information. For those who are interested in this endeavor, she provided handouts which show the preferred method for listing any relative you may come across in your search. A single page listing will have information on you as the

starting point, your father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, great grandfather and great grandmother. All this plus the same information for your wife's side. For information on relatives that migrated to the U.S. she recommends contacting the particular government archival office where the relative first entered the country. Mrs. Stevens recommends the "My Heritage" website for additional information on "finding your roots". She also will teach two classes on genealogy at Delta College next spring. Contact SICL (Stockton Institute for Continued Learning) at Delta for more information on this.

During the luncheon, Dave Scotten was sworn in as the latest member of Branch 46. Dave is a transfer from Branch 87 in Stockton and was a Credit Representative for PG&E. Complete information on Dave is provided in this edition.

LITTLE SIR RAMBLING – For those with flexibility problems

This month I am offering some candid plain talk with some suggestions about how to deal with personal hygiene problems that may be affecting my fellow SIRS or a family member due to flexibility problems caused by arthritis, sciatica, or being wheelchair bound, etc. I am one of those with flexibility problems so I am speaking from experience. Your hygiene problem maybe merely being able to shower or bathe completely or they may be about having difficulty in being able to wipe properly after a bowel movement. These hygiene issues are embarrassing to many and rarely do you hear anyone trying to discuss and seek information so I decided to offer the information here so they don't have to feel embarrassed or uncomfortable in asking.

The bathing and showering problem is the easiest to deal with. You simply refit your shower or bath with a shower wand with a flexible hose that you can move around with your hand to reach everywhere. You use it in conjunction with a cheap tool available in larger pharmacies that looks like a plastic rod with a clamping mechanism to hold a washcloth to reach your backside from the front or back. You need to double the washcloth in the holder to enable the clamp to retain the washcloth during soap application and scrubbing. If you are traveling you can inquire of hotels and motels if they have rooms equipped with the shower wands. Some have them in all rooms and some may only have them in rooms for the handicapped. I take the wash cloth gripping tool with me when I travel.

Some people try to deal with their rear personal hygiene problems by wearing adult diapers or wearing some kind of pad in their underwear to avoid fecal stains coming through to exterior clothing or into their underwear. They may also keep flushable wet wipes with them to further aid them when they are out in public and need to use the restroom. You may have to rely on these when you travel but at least when you are home the majority of the time you have a much better option... the after- market bidet attachment that retrofits your existing toilet. I know if you are like me you pretty much thought the bidet was something for women's hygiene and had no practical use by men. The aftermarket bidet attachments available at your hardware store or online have a knob that you use to adjust the water spray to either front or back. The knob also adjusts for water pressure. The add-on bidet fits under your toilet seat and raises it about a quarter inch. It connects to the existing flex line that is on the toilet plumbing. When using the bidet you will find the water stream is fixed so you will have to lean forward or back or to one side for the water jet to do its job. The only thing you are using toilet paper for is to double check and dry off. You will use a lot less toilet paper if you have a bidet. People are buying them who don't have flexibility problems for just this reason.

I hope this information is helpful to my fellow SIRS who need it now and may be used to others in the future if they develop flexibility problems.....
