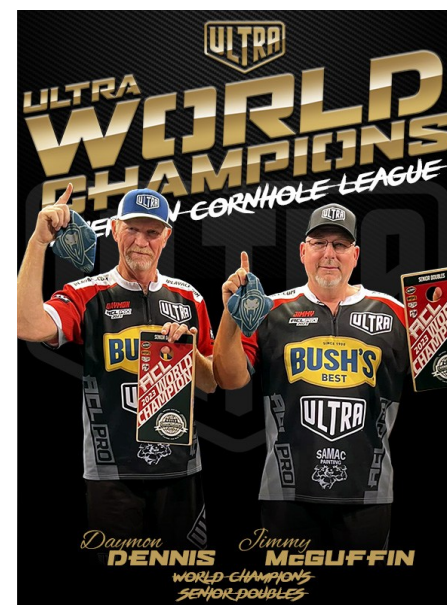

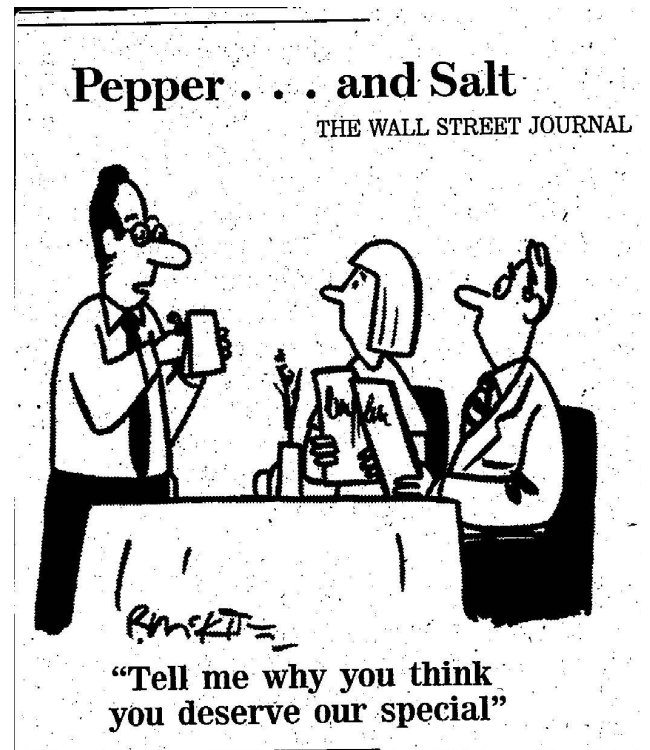

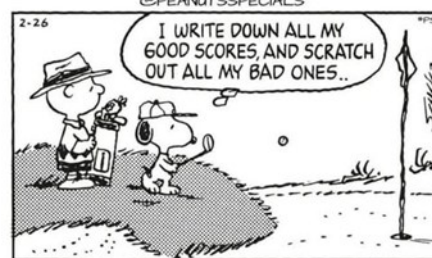

We just completed week thirty-two of the winter-spring session. We start up again on May 7 for the summer session, which usually consists of 10 teams (down from 16) of 3 bowlers. Yes, we are still bowling at Steve Cook's Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights on Wednesdays 12:30-3:00pm. We just finished week 32 of 32 in April 2025. We will take a 1 week break. There will be no reports for the summer as there are only 2 SIRs bowlers from our Branch 49.

The league is called the "Senior Fun" Bowling League. The league normally consists of 16 three-person teams (10 during the summer). The league consists of many SIRs members from other chapters. The league is a mixed gender and "handicap" league, currently with several women (none from SIRs).

Currently, there are 8 Branch 49 SIRs bowlers. They are:

Ray Jerd (148 avg), John McKim (141), Bob Collins (152); Alan Wong (134), Jim Boles (aka Bowls!!) (142), Ron Peters (135); Tom Coultas (Avg 110; is now a substitute), along with Mike Panelo (Avg 149).

We are all still working on our handicap but showing progress. Ray, John and Bob are on the "Gold" team, and finished in 3rd place. Alan is on the "Nuggets" in 13th place. Jim Boles is on the "Claim Jumpers," in 11th place. Ron Peters is on "Young at Heart" in 2nd place!! Whoopie! These are the final standings.

Jim Boles (aka Bowls) has the current high handicap game of 318 and handicap series of 810 for our group. Bob Collins still has the current average of 152 – and a good series of 569 (several weeks ago) for the SIRs bowlers. (Not bad, but not quite in the same "league" as Jim Boles.). We have had a few drop-outs recently....more to follow. John McKim comes in at an average of 141. Alan Wong recently bowled a high game of 184 (a few weeks ago)! Good job Alan. Jim Boles still has the high game of 239 and high scratch series of 573. Wow!! Congrats to all!! Despite inconsistent scores, we ARE having fun.....or so I'm told.

Most of our chapter bowlers in the league consider a "good" average as anything above 165, and a series of 500 or more. As I have previously reported, several of our SIRs bowlers seem to all be working on increasing our handicap. (Yeah, you read that right! Haha.) Some might say we are "sandbagging" for the end of session tournament. Go for it! The handicap makes things competitive.

Each week consists two teams competing against each other for three games. The better you bowl, (or depending on how much beer you drink), the more fun you have! The cost to bowl each week is \$15.00, and you have to pay even if you miss a week or more. The league also has a raffle each Wednesday which helps to fund the season ending prizes "pot of gold." There are money prizes for best teams, best bowler, high score among others, at the end of each season (Spring, summer, winter).

Scoring for placement consists of 1 point for each team game "win" (including handicap), and 2 points for the team with the high series score (including handicap) for each week. A team can get 0 to 5 points each week. The standings are based on the number of points a team accumulates throughout the season.
