We bowl at the Steve Cook Fireside lanes on Auburn Boulevard each Wednesday 12:30 PM. The league is called the "Senior Fun" bowling league. The better you bowl, the more fun you have! The league consists of 16 three person teams. The league is a mixed gender "handicap" league, currently with three women. Handicap is based on a 220 raw score.


