

**Don Weden** is a retired **Principal Planner for the Santa Clara County Planning Office**, where he served for 34 years before retiring in 2003. During his tenure, he managed a wide array of planning studies, including the last comprehensive revision of the County's General Plan.

Since his retirement, Weden has served as an unpaid community advisor and educator, focusing on preparing local communities for significant demographic and environmental changes. His advocacy emphasizes evolving from automobile-dependent suburbs to intelligently more urban environments that support walking, mass transit, and multigenerational living. He is a key figure in presentations such as "Santa Clara County 3.0" and "Urbanism After the Pandemic," which explore alternative scenarios for the county's future growth.

In 2013, he was inducted into the Planner Emeritus Network of the California Chapter of the American Planning Association. Weden holds a master's in city and regional planning from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and a BA in political science from the University of Minnesota. He continues to engage with the public through presentations on topics like "Cities for All Ages" and "Envisioning a multigenerational Agrihood."
