Possible Amendments

1. Amend the Articles of Incorporation for SIR, Incorporated to remove the word "retired" so that it is clear that being retired is not a condition for membership.

Men do not retire early but commonly work into their 70s and 80s. Those that do retire early often undertake a second career. Most branches have members who are working full or part time. Retirement should not be a condition to membership.

2. Amend Bylaw 110 to remove geographical limits preventing branches and members in Southern California.

Interest has been expressed in possibly having branches open in Southern California. Our Bylaws prohibit any branches outside of Northern and Central California. Given the use of Zoom and other available management tools, there is no reason for the restriction if a market for SIR exists in Southern California.


