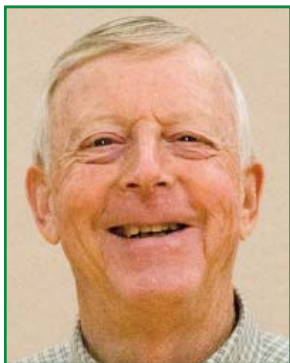

Branch 59 hosted the SIR State Bowling Tournament on May 1, 2, & 3, 2016, at Cloverleaf Bowling Center. The tournament consisted of a four-man team event and a doubles event. With 92 bowlers from all over Northern California coming to Fremont to show off their skills, our own bowlers did quite well.

The team of Sir Howard Elz, Sir Ron Hamro, Sir Jim Ploor (bowling in his first tournament) and Sir Miguel Ferras placed **first** in the B division. The team of Sir Don Henry, Sir Victor Okumura, Sir Kasey Warner (branch 6), and Sir Rich Bowers (Branch 6) placed second in the B division. The team of Sir Jerry Sabo, Sir Roger Wallin, Sir Frank Cordova and Sir Larry Sallee placed third in the A division.

In A division doubles Sir Larry Sallee and Sir Frank Cordova place second and Sir Laverl Tomlinson and Sir Donal Spicer placed fifth. In B division doubles Sir Harvey McAninch and Charles Bailey (Branch 39) placed second, Sir Victor Okumura, and Sir Rich Bowers (Branch 6) placed fourth with Sir Jerry Sabo and Sir Roger Wallin placing fifth.

In All Events (total of team and doubles scores) in A division Sir Jerry Sabo placed second, Sir Larry Sallee placed fourth. In B division Sir Harvey McAninch placed first with Sir Rich Bowers fourth, Sir Victor Okumura (again) placing fifth Sir Jim Ploor placing ninth.
