OUR SPEAKER

Bob St. Clair, a San Francisco native. started his football career at Polytechnic High School and earned a scholarship to the University of San Francisco. While attending USF, Bob jumped into the national spotlight with the rest of the team that saw 9 players go to the NFL the following sea-

son. In fact, three players, including Bob, were eventually inducted into the prestigious NFL Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

When USF dropped football, Bob St. Clair finished his college playing days at the University of Tulsa and was drafted in the third round by the San Francisco Forty-Niners. Bob had the size, speed, intelligence and the hitting ability, he excelled as both a run and pass blocker, and in 1956, he was responsible for blocking 10 field goals.

During his twelve years tenure with the 49ers, Bob was All-Pro three times and chosen to play in the Pro Bowl five times. He served as the 49ers team captain and wore number 79, which was retired last year by the SF Forty-Niners.

The culmination of all honors received by Bob St. Clair came in 1990 when he was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame. In his class were such outstanding names as Buck Buchanan, Bob Griese, Franco Harris, Ted Hendricks, Jack Lambert, and Tom Landry which completed the rest of the inductees Another outstanding honor was afforded to Bob just a few years ago when the field at Kezar Stadium in San Francisco was renamed "Bob St. Clair Field." This field is where Bob played his high school, college and professional football.

He continued to pursue politics as San Mateo County Su-

pervisor from 1966-74, and again as a lobbyist out of Orange County, CA. Currently he and his wife of 54 years, Ann, live in Santa Rosa where Bob is involved in public relations and sales for Clover Stornetta Farms.

Bob will talk about the NFL of the past as it compares with that of today.

Edited Excerpts from the Minutes of Sir Al Wydler

Big Sir Don Henry called the meeting to order at 10:15 am. Roll Call following the Pledge of Allegiance indicated all Officers and Directors to be present. Minutes of January 2003 were approved with corrections.

A letter from State President Jim Faverman reported that they were able to obtain the same coverage of insurance through another company with just a \$175 annual premium increase. Also reported was a drop of 874 men from November 2001 to November 2002. Our latest figures show we have a membership of 26,005.

Acting upon the January 2003 meeting suggestion, the Honorary Life members were appointed as the nominating committee for suggesting future Honorary Life Member appointments.

Attendance Committee Chairman Fred Gotthardt reported that a total of 215 members and seven guests are expected to be present at lunch today. He also reported a Cybergeezer meeting next Monday.

The Big Sir wished to commend Les Addison, who resigned as Chair of the Membership Committee, for outstanding service the many past years. New Membership Chairman Sir Ed Bingle reported that four new members and seven guests are expected. Sir Art Winkley reported 23 birthdays this month ages ranging from 62 to 87 years including 2 members of the Executive committee.

Sir Drag Dutina, Historian and Bridge Chairman has available the formats used in the past to help recommend the appointment of Honorary Life Members. He would like more Bridge players.

The Nominating Committee reports they are still working on two candidates for 2004.



ANTHONY B. COSOLA

Anthony Cosola of Fremont died February 19 at age 79. He was a member of SIR Branch 59 since 1997.

His wife Patricia; his children Anthony Cosola Jr., J. Christopher Cosola, Carl Cosola, Michael Cosola, Theresa August, Patrick Cosola, and Mary Cosola; and 8 grandchildren survive him. His first wife, Naomi, passed away in 1983.

He was a veteran of WWII and the Korean War, retiring in 1963 with the rank of Lt. Col. after 20 years of service. Highlights of his military career include the last and secret bombing run over Japan, after the atomic bombs were dropped in Hiroshima and Nagasaki. He was the navigator for the mission, which is chronicled in the recent book, The Last Mission. That mission is also subject of an upcoming documentary on the History Channel.

In February 1957, he received an official commendation for organizing and directing the search and rescue operation of a crashed C-124 aircraft near Kimpo, Korea. He received the U.S. Air Force Commendation Medal for Meritorious Service in March 1963 for his work in the Air Force's Office of Special Investigation.

After his retirement from the Air Force, he enjoyed a 25-year career as an investigator with the U.S. Department Labor. He was an investigator on the Colonial Pipe Line Co. fraud and extortion case in Newark, NJ, that resulted in the indictments of a former mayor of Newark, NJ, the city council president, and the president of the Operating Engineers Union Local 825 in 1967.

In his later years, he volunteered with a Fremont adult literacy program, taught safe-driving classes to senior citizens in Fremont through AARP's 55 Alive Program, worked as a management-training consultant for NUMMI in Fremont, sat on the Fremont Police Oral Board for police officer candidates, and was active in Fremont politics.
