OUR SPEAKER

by Little Sir Tom Sherba

Fremont Fire Chief William McDonald will discuss the status and future of the Fremont Fire Department during the present budgetary crunch.



William "Willie" McDonald is a 45-year-old native of California, born as the seventh of eight children and raised in Fresno, California, McDonald received a Bachelors Degree in Biology from California State University,

Fresno in 1984. He later moved to the SF Bay Area in 1993 and received a Master's Degree in Business Administration from California State University, Hayward in 1995. McDonald is also a graduate of the Executive Fire Officer Program through the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, Maryland and has completed the State and Local Government Program for Senior Executives at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.

The Fresno City Fire Department hired McDonald in 1978 as a Firefighter and he was promoted through the ranks to the position of Deputy Chief in 1990 responsible for the Bureau of Training and Support Services until his departure in 1993.

Willie was appointed as the City of Foster City Fire Chief in 1993 and became the City of San Mateo Fire Chief in 1996. He joined the City of Fremont Fire Department in July 2002 as the City's fifth fire Chief following Chief Dan Lydon (a member of SIR Branch 59) who contributed over 40 years of dedicated service to the community. McDonald is a member of the California Fire Chiefs' Association, the International Association of Fire Chiefs, the League of California Cities Public Safety Policy Committee, is a past president of the San Mateo County Fire Chiefs' Association and past president of the League of California Cities Fire Chiefs' Department.

Chief McDonald is married and has two young sons, Joshua (11) and Jordan (9) who are involved the Fremont Football League.

Edited Excerpts from the Minutes of Sir Al Wydler



Big Sir Don Henry called the meeting to order at 10:15 am. Roll Call following the Pledge of Allegiance indicated all Officers and Directors to be present. Minutes of February 2003 were approved with corrections.

The State Organization Region 6 Director requested our recommendation for Area 8 Governor. It was agreed that the name Robert Beam be submitted for Governor.

State Growth Committee Chairman Jim Wyatt, expressed concern over the loss in membership. He offered assistance to any branch desiring additional members. To help his plan-

ning it was requested that all branches be accurate in reporting their status on Big Sir Monthly Membership Report, Form 56.

Big Sir Don Henry requested comments on how to cope with the "No Show" members for each meeting. Sir Herb Epstein made a motion to charge those who do not call in to cancel their standing order for lunch. Sir Rollin Cunningham seconded the motion. Sir Fred Gotthardt reported that despite sketchy information, he is able to predict attendance within about five people. Following a great deal of discussion, Sir Les Addison volunteered to telephone those members who were unexcused. Sir Fred Stabell recommended that phone calls - one on one - to offenders would be more personal and effective. We should therefore accept Les Addison's offer to do this. Sir Herb Epstein withdrew his motion. It was suggested that the problem be highlighted in our newsletter, *The Pathfinder*, in order to inform our members.

Attendance Committee Chairman Sir Fred Gotthardt reported that a total of 225 attendees including seven guests are projected to be present at lunch today. He also reported that there would be a Cybergeezer meeting next Monday. Membership Chairman Sir Ed Bingle reported that three new members are expected today. Sir Art Winkley reports 27 birthdays this month, including 6 of our committee members. ranging in ages from 63 to 96 years.

Sir Stu Lane resigned as editor of The Pathfinder newsletter due to illness. His assistant, Sir John Skarpelos is now editor and also responsible for the roster. Sir Fred Gotthardt will be his assistant.

Sir Guy Whitener, Golf Chairman reported that 59 members of SIR entered the Manteca tournament to be held March 25th, an excellent participation.

Sir Fred Gotthardt reported for the Nominating Committee that the following candidates for officers are nominated for 2004: Big Sir - Tom Sherba, Little Sir - Howard Thompson, Secretary - Al Wydler, Assistant Secretary - Drag Dutina, Treasurer - Lou Bufkin, Assistant Treasurer - Fred Stabell. Nominated for Directors: Herb Epstein, Don Gillis, Don Henry, Chris Lemler, Frank Thomas, and Guy Whitener.

Sir Robert Beam, Area Governor, reports that Insurance for travel events, may limit coverage. "The number of guests participating in a SIR travel event shall not exceed the number of active members participating plus affiliated SIR members participating." (Rule 367.1)
