## Words to Live By by Big Sir Don Henry

Did you know??? That Branch #59 is a spin-off from Branch #26 which used to be in San Leandro? There were three meetings in March

## OUR SPEAKER By Little Sir Tom Sherba

Part of the specialization of specific units to combat crime in Fremont includes the development of a **Crime Scene Investigations (CSI) Unit**. The CSI unit is responsible for documenting, collecting and processing evidence at all serious crime scenes.

Officer Gary Cooper is a member of the CSI team and has been with the police department for 23 years. Gary grew up in Fremont and graduated from Mission San Jose High School in 1977. He joined the Fremont Police Explorer Post while in High School and quickly decided a career in Law Enforcement was for him. He served in the US Army Military Police Corps for three years and was stationed in Vicenza Italy. Gary was hired by the Fremont Police Department in 1981 and attended the Oakland Police Academy, graduating as class Valedictorian. He was assigned the Patrol Division working the midnight shift for the next 9 years. Gary also worked on a Drunk Driving Enforcement Team in the mid 80's. He tested for a Detective position and was assigned to the Investigations Unit in 1989 as a Financial Crimes Investigator. In 1995 he received the Financial Crimes Investigator of the Year award for solving a 1.6 million dollar credit card fraud ring. Gary returned to the Patrol Division in 1995 and became a crime scene investigator in 2000. As a member of the CSI, Gary has attended numerous schools to learn some of the science and methodology of crime scene investigations. Some of the schools include death investigations, photography, blood spatter analysis, print processing, trace evidence, anthropology and DNA collection. In his off duty time, Gary enjoys fly-fishing, boating and bowling and recently took a bronze medal in bowling at the 2003 Police Olympics.

Gary will be giving an overview of the Police Department's CSI unit and some of the capabilities the police department has to investigate crime scenes.
