History of Branch 59 continued from last month...

In 1987 there were 183 active and 19 inactive members. Due to lack of interest the Reno trip, Bahama cruise, tour of Disney World, Space Center and a Canada tour were all cancelled. Golf



and bowling tournaments were held in Fremont. Trips were made to the Ames Laboratory and to the Flying Lady restaurant and picnic at Ardenwood Park. The Newark Pavilion is raising the rent again, considering changing location - again.

In 1988 there were 185 active and 18 inactive members. Two successful trips were made: 44 went to Reno and 40 to Yosemite for 3 days. Golf at Sunol and Bowling at Mowry were member activities. Christmas/Installation party was held at Mission Garden restaurant. Newark Pavilion raised rate to \$100 per month. Special committee found Elks Lodge. Sit-down instead of buffet, nicer decor and atmosphere, cheaper bar and rent. The move was approved.

In 1989 and 1990 there were 198 active and 12 inactive members. Successful trip to Ft. Bragg; dropped Alaska trip. Rejected request to tape speakers for those not attending. No smoking policy re-established. Pavilion wanted us to come back at the old rate. Secret ballot of membership was unanimous for the Elks.

Today our limit is 299 members and as of last month we had 281 active members. I think last year we had about 40 new members but only increased membership by 4 due to turnover.

Nowhere did I see mention of Honorary Life Members so I guess they are more recent. That Honor is granted for outstanding contributions to Branch 59. We qualify for five HLM's and they are currently David Marymee, Lyle Kingery,

IN MEMORIAM **GEORGE R. URQUHART**

George Urquhart died on Saturday, October 4, 2003 at the age of 71. He was a member of Sons in Retirement (SIR) since January 2000.
