Tom and his wife, Gail, have two sons. One is a senior in high school and the other is a sophomore in College. His wife is a Graduate Student Advisor at the University of California Santa Barbara. She will be retiring in about four years and is looking forward to joining her husband at the Veterans Home.

The California Department of Veterans Affairs operates the Veterans Home of California with campuses at Yountville, in Napa County; Barstow, in San Bernardino County; and Chula Vista in San Diego County. The CDVA is in the process of building five new Veterans Homes in West Los Angeles, Lancaster, Saticoy, Fresno and Redding.

Travel for Area 8


