Branch 59 2003 History by Branch Historian Drag Dutina

The officers and directors selected in 2003 to serve in 2004 are shown in the column on the left on this page. The membership totaled 279 at the start of the year and at year-end it was 272. Thirty (30) new members joined the Branch in 2003. There were also 17 inactive members.

The treasury held \$5546 at the beginning of 2003 and stands at \$5946 at year's end.

The Branch has held monthly luncheons at the Elk's Lodge in Fremont since 1988 but a quadrupling of rent at that facility prompted a move to the Swiss Park in Newark where pricing was more favorable. The first meeting at this site took place in September successfully as did the subsequent ones through year-end. The attendance at luncheons averaged 209. The two traditional social events, the Sweetheart (Venice Revisited) and Holiday (Holiday in Switzerland) luncheons were well attended and enjoyed by all. Thanks are due to the strong efforts of the Social Committee under the leadership of Sir Bob Benya, who organized and ran these events.

The speakers at the monthly luncheons recruited by Little Sir Tom Sherba were varied and interesting William Egan of Morgan Stanley talked of the outlook and strategy for investments in 2003; Alnoor Koorji from Advanced Hearing Instruments talked of symptoms, causes and corrective actions for hearing problems; Bob St. Clair, a member of the NFL Hall of Fame, compared the character of the NFL past and present; Fremont Fire Chief William Mc Donald discussed the present and future of Fremont's F.D. during the budgetary crunch; Officer Gary Cooper gave an overview of The Fremont Police's Criminal

The month of November saw the beginning balance \$3524.07. November ended with a balance of \$7421.92 that included checks for the annual December Installation Luncheon. Our expenses consisted of the usual set-up fees, printing, and postage supplies.

Carrying over into December, our Christmas Luncheon raised \$3270 in ticket sales and \$722 in door prize sales for a total of \$3992. Expenses for the luncheon were entertainment, set-up, programs, decorations and the caterer for a total of \$3171.50. Altogether, the Annual luncheon raised \$820.50 for our treasury.

Our ending December balance was \$5746.42, which included \$104.00 for the Golf account.

Investigation Unit (CSI) and other capabilities the Department has to investigate crime scenes; Captain Leon "Woodie" Spears, one of the few surviving original Tuskegee airmen spoke of his experiences during two wars; Burl Toler, a NFL official for 25 years, described the transition of the League from when he officiated to the present; Paul Piraino, General Manager of the Alameda County Water District, described the first brackish water desalination facility in northern CA.
