Our Speaker - Bob Parsons

Three years ago our speaker, Bob Parsons, 55, awoke from a brief nap on a plane trip to Taiwan in a blur. He stared blankly at unfamiliar faces in front of him, only aware of voices. Awake, but confused, he descended the plane's steps, carried his luggage through customs, and checked into his hotel. When he settled into his room he put on his reading glasses, but could

He assumed he had the eye disease, conjunctivitis, but doctors at Stanford Hospital later told him he had suffered a stroke, caused by an aneurysm in his heart. In January of 2001, after undergoing surgery to fix his enlarged aorta, Parsons was not interested in going back to work as a businessman. He learned the meaning of being disabled and recovering and then needing other people to help him. He could not lift a dinner plate with two hands and had to take baby steps until he could walk again.

Parsons decided to educate people about the warning signs of stroke and spread the word that medical treatments do exist. Parsons earned his engineering degree and master's in business administration from Stanford University. What had been a challenge before was now just painful. He was forgetting things, and second-guessing himself And what he wanted to do was see if he could have fun doing what he had always done, which was interact with people, give presentations, and help people. So, Parsons stopped working and began volunteering for the Peninsula Stroke Association in Palo Alto and the Stanford Stroke Center. Stroke advocacy became his full-time passion.

While most people can rattle off the symptoms of a heart attack and know how to respond, few people know how to interpret the often confusing and subtle signs of stroke. In this talk, given by a stroke survivor and developed in conjunction with the Stanford Stroke Center, you will hear firsthand what it feels like to have a stroke, how to recognize the symptoms in yourself and others, and how to respond to this life-threatening event.


Sir Dave Dunlap reports forthcoming Bowling tournaments at Petaluma March 8 and another March 22nd at Concord.
