### Our Speaker - Dr. John Dearborn

Dr. John T. Dearborn was born in Berkeley, California and graduated from Acalanes High School in Lafayette, CA. He attended Stanford University, and the University of California - School of Medicine.

He completed his training in General and Orthopedic surgery at University of California in San Francisco.
