Our Speaker – Mel Odemar

Mel Odemar graduated from Humboldt University in 1961 with a BS in fisheries science. He worked with the California Department of Fish and Game (DFG) from 1962 to 1997. He started work as an observer on oil exploration boats working off California and then monitored research projects including shrimp, Dungeness crab, sport fishing assessment, and inshore marine environmental studies.

From 1968 to 1969 he was in charge of sea otter investigations regarding conflicts between sea otters and the abalone fishery.

From 1969 to 1970 he worked for The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nation on fisheries assessment and development in Argentina.

He returned to DFG and was in charge of diving based investigations of near shore fisheries and marine pollution in Southern California. From 1974 to 1992 he worked on multi-state marine fisheries management and then became Environmental Program Manager for the Office of Oil Prevention and Response until his retirement in 1997. He had primary responsibility for establishing an Oiled Wildlife Research and Rescue Center in Santa Cruz.

Mel lives in Fair Oaks with his wife, JoAnn and has a married daughter. His hobby is bird watching, which has taken him to many places including Africa and Antarctica.

He will speak to us about his experiences during his lengthy career.

Edited Excerpts from the January 20th Minutes of Drag Dutina



The meeting was called to order at 10:20 am on 1/20/2005. Following the pledge of Allegiance, Roll Call showed that 5 Officers and 4 Directors were present. Our Secretary Al Wydler was absent due to illness that caused him to be hospitalized.

Big Sir Thompson noted that there have been recent signals from State and Area level officials that the Branch should reduce its funding surplus. This direction probably stems from concern about our status as a non-profit organization and potential tax consequences if our funding looks too healthy. There does not appear to be any specific guidelines in the by-laws on this subject (Sir Skarpelos). Nevertheless, the Executive Committee decided to decrease the luncheon cost by \$1 to erode the surplus.

Sir Thompson discussed criteria for selecting "Sir of the Month." The first honorees will be announced at today's luncheon. He also sought suggestions about replacing or repairing the Branch banner that is showing considerable wear. Sir Howard announced that the Branch's goal for the year is 50 guests. He reported that the training session, held in San Ramon was run efficiently.

An audit of the Branch treasury and check books was conducted by **Sirs Fernandez and Fernelius** and found to be in excellent order for which Sir Lou is again to be complimented. The auditors suggested that form 28 mandated by the state is archaic and should be revised. Some changes in the tracking of certain expenses and the use of cash receipts were also suggested.

Little Sir Addison announced that the speaker for the Luncheon would be Philip Acra who will describe the history and activities of the St. Vincent de Paul organization.

Sir Gotthardt that attendance for today's luncheon is estimated to be 210. He also announced that the next Cybergeezzer meeting

would be held on Tuesday 1/25 at the Newark library at @ 2 pm.

Sir Winkley indicated that there were 24 member birthdays in December (ages ranging from 63 to 90) and 13 in January (ages ranging from 63 to 83). It was agreed that the winner of the Birthday table drawing would receive a bolo rather than a refund of his luncheon ticket, as was the previous case.

Sir Lord announced that tickets will be available for a Warrior /Supersonic game on 4/13, a Giant/ Brave game on 7/20 and an A's/ Angels game on 8/11.

Sir Skarpelos announced that the 2005 rosters have already been completed and will be distributed at the end of today's Luncheon. (Great going John!) He also noted that input for the Pathfinder is 1/28.

Sir Cunningham reports that the next bowling tournaments will be in Napa on 2/7 and Livermore on 2/15.

Sir Leake stated that that the golf group is down 8 members. The next 2 tournaments are in San Diego in April and in Las Vegas in May

Sir Bingle reported the addition of 4 new members and change of status of 4 members...

Sir Edwards asked whether he should order some golf type hats that he was out of and was instructed to do so.

Sir Marymee informed us on illnesses and deaths among members.

Sir Fernelius announced that the State semi-annual RV and Golf activity will take place at French Camp starting April 25th.

Sir Dutina thanked the Big Sir for arranging a convenient parking space for a handicapped bridge player.

Sir Henry has been authorized to purchase 300 pens at a cost of \$150. They will have a Sons in Retirement and Branch 59 inscription on them. They will be distributed to the membership for PR purposes.

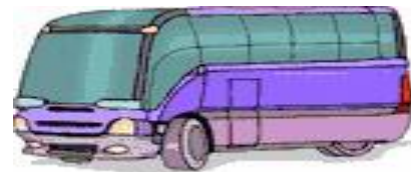
