History 2004

Membership totaled 272 active members at the beginning of the 2004. At the end of the year membership had been reduced to 261 active members and 24 inactive members. Although 21 new members joined Branch 59 in 2004, it was not enough to offset membership attrition due to resignations, deceased members, and other causes.

The treasury held \$5,746.42 at the beginning of 2004 and stood at \$4,214.42 at the end of the year.

All luncheons were held at Swiss Park in Newark for the year, as a continuation of the changeover made in 2003 from the Elks Lodge. The average attendance at the luncheons came to 187. The "holiday" luncheons- the May Sweetheart Party and the Christmas Party were well attended and turned out to be huge successes thanks to the outstanding efforts of Sir David Tanner and his Social Committee. What made the Sweetheart Party so special was the presentation of an Honorary Life Membership to Sir Fred Gotthardt by SIR President Jim Musci.

The speakers recruited by Little Sir Howard Thompson were very stimulating and covered a range of topics. The January speaker, Tom Murray, described life styles and amenities that the California Veterans Home in Yountville offers veterans. Bob Michael a noted authority on the history of aviation in the SF Bay Area described the early developments of air travel in these environs for the February luncheon. The March speaker, Bob Parsons, spoke about strokes, the warning signs and the way to respond to one. Bob having been a stroke victim himself was able to convince the audience on the importance of being aware of stroke symptoms. The April speaker, although renowned for wine making, Fred Weibel (Weibel Vineyards), enlightened his audience with his experiences in "Angel Flight". This is an organization that flies medical patients to and from medical treatments. The June luncheon gave us Jim Hollabaugh an avid historian of the Revolutionary War, who described the religious faith of the founding fathers, their religious beliefs, and why it mattered to them and ultimately to the fledgling Nation.

Dr. Charlie Self spoke on a very timely subject, the history of the Summer Olympic Games (and they were going on in Athens, Greece as he spoke). His comments and knowledge brought back memories of the great American athletes that competed in them. The August luncheon featured the very important and often misunderstood topic of Reverse Mortgages, ably discussed by Dave Brown, a reverse mortgage consultant with Wells Fargo. Mr Brown described various scenarios for reverse

mortgages to better show who should and who should not acquire a reverse mortgage. Financial advice was on the menu for the September luncheon, as the guest speaker, Pat Vitucci, a well known financial adviser gave the SIR audience much good advice for situations that may arise in an uncertain future. Our October luncheon speaker, Dr. John T Dearborn, performs knee and hip replacement surgery at the Washington Hospital and Stanford University. Several SIR members could attest to his consummate skill, as he has performed the operation on them. He described the procedures and the post operation recovery rate. The November luncheon featured Mr Louis Chicoine of the Tri City Homeless coalition. He related his mission to the SIR group, which is to return homeless people to stable housing, while improving their skills and self-reliance.

Bowling, golf, walking/hiking, computer classes (Cybergeezers Sir Fred Gotthardt's domain) are the major activities sponsored by Branch 59. Sir Dave Dunlap and Sir Bill Leake ably handle Bowling and Golf respectively. The quality of bowlers and golfers in Branch 59 can be attested to phenomenal scores garnered by some of the members. Sir Don Henry and Sir Frank Cordova bowl in the 240's and 250's. That's pretty serious bowling! In addition there is a lending library available for reading and browsing. The success of these activities can be attributed to the various Committee Chairmen and their assistants.

One of the many bright spots in Branch 59 is the Pathfinder, superbly edited by Sir John Skarpelos with the able assistance of Sir Fred Gotthardt.

Sir Dave Marymee of the Sunshine Committee continues the difficult task of reporting on illness and deaths among the members and providing a contact with the families on behalf of the Branch.

Overall, Branch 59 enjoyed a fun year thanks to the active participation of the members.
