This year's sweetheart luncheon's theme was "The Old West" and it certainly looked like the old west when the attendees entered through the swinging saloon doors and were able to




check all of the wanted posters of the Branch 59 desperados. Many if not all the Sirs and their partners dressed as gents and gals from the old west to enhance the mood.

Sir Louis Bufkin awarded Honorary Life Membership

At the May Sweetheart Luncheon SIR President Jim Donovan presented Sir Louis Bufkin with an Honorary Life Membership.

Lou spent 22 years teaching at Washington High School in Fremont, retiring in 1987.

He became a member of Sons In Retirement Pathfinder Branch 59 on October 20, 1988. He is one of those persons who has contributed to the growth and stability of the branch throughout his membership.

Lou was elected to the office of Assistant Secretary in 1990 and became the branch secretary the following year. From 1992 through 1997 he served as the assistant treasurer and in February of 1998, he took over as the treasurer of Branch 59 and has served in that position ever since in an exemplary manner. He continues to fulfill the duties of branch treasurer and takes this role seriously.

Lou was born in Lamesa, Texas in June of 1927 but his family moved to Hobbs, New Mexico where he grew up. He graduated from Hobbs High School where he also met his wife, Beverly.

He had an Athletic Scholarship when he entered Texas Technological University in Lubbock, Texas. He joined the Navy during WWII as an Aviation Radioman. Six months after the war was over he returned to Texas Tech to finish his schooling. He obtained a Bachelors degree and Masters degree in Education. He and Beverly got married in 1947 (58 years ago).

Lou taught high school in Sundown Texas for 9 years after he graduated from Texas Tech. Later he went back to his old High School in Hobbs where he taught for two years. In 1960 he moved to the Oakland School district teaching at Oakland Technical High School for five years.

In 1965 Lou joined the teaching staff at Washington High School in Fremont where he remained until his retirement.
