Our Speaker – Don Dillon By Little Sir Les Addison

Our speaker for July is Don Dillon, Sr. He is a native of El Centro and came to Mission San Jose in 1954, two years before the City was incorporated. Don and his father had a small dwarf citrus tree business in Ventura that was threatened by urbanization and a tree disease so they moved to MSJ where they founded the Four Winds Growers Nursery on Palm Ave. and have been there ever since. His son and grandson are the active operators of their Fremont growing grounds and his daughter, son-in-law, and grandson are the active operators of their branch nursery in Winters, CA.

Don served in the Navy during WWII and then again in the Korean War where he served on a destroyer escort, reaching the rank of Commander.

In 1962 he was elected to the City Council in Fremont. He served as mayor for five of the sixteen years he was on the City Council. He was a driving force in establishing Lake Elizabeth Park. His work also included saving three historical homes and gardens in the area.

In 1981 Don was elected President of the International Plant Propagators Society and in 1987 was presented with the Pacific Coast Nurseryman Award. He served on the regional boards of the San Francisco Bay Area, was president of the Association of Bay Area Government (ABAG) and a member of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. Today he lives in Carmel with his wife, Maryann.

Don will present a pictorial history of Fremont using photos from his private collection.

Sir Ed Bingle reports 5 new members, 1 to inactive status and 3 terminated.


Sir Nat Lord reporting for Bowling, Six bowlers won cash prizes in May.

RAY JARVIS is under full bed care at the Country Drive Care Center. Ray likes visitors. Bring a book as Ray likes to read.




